### **Letter from the President**

The summer has certainly gone fast. It seems like June Day was only a few weeks ago, but it's actually been over two months since it took place. September will be a busy month, especially during its third weekend when the Steak Roast takes place on Friday evening, 9/14, followed by the Home & Garden Tour on Saturday, 9/15. The fall Garage Sale will occur on Saturday 9/29, and it should be a good opportunity for bargains. Please look for the articles in this Tattler that will provide more details.

The August meeting of the Board of Directors was a blend of the old and the new, as Board meetings tend to be. There were the important functions of approving meeting minutes and proposed agendas as well as reports by officers and directors about policies and events that they are responsible for. The words and phrases used are very familiar, but putting them all together it adds up to the fact that major changes are happening within NRPCA. More than anything else this is due to the Civic Association transitioning from a 501(c)(4) to a 501(c)(3) organization. Even though both of these labels identify us as a tax-exempt nonprofit, the additional tax-deductible status of being a 501(c)(3) requires a higher level of financial reporting than before. For instance, NRPCA now has to register annually with the State of Michigan Attorney General's Office in order to solicit and accept donations, including membership dues. Additional tax schedules providing more details of where our revenues come

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from are now required when we file our annual federal taxes. Annual financial audits will become routine in the future.

To facilitate our financial record keeping and the data exchanges between the NRPCA's Treasurer and Building Manager all of NRPCA's financial records



have been transferred to QuickBooks software. They are also being stored in the "cloud" so that they are protected from potential computer system failures such as the lethal power surge that occurred in July to the DTE transformer that serves the Community House. We're also in the final stages of re-organizing NRPCA's financial accounts into categories that will better align with modern accounting methods. Discussion is also taking place about integrating some portions of the Treasure's records with the membership database that I mentioned in last month's column. There's more to be considered, such as using third-party services for payroll and/or annual taxes, and you'll be informed if these are implemented.

In last month's article I mentioned that NRPCA submitted a grant proposal to obtain the services of a professional fundraising consultant to assess our potential to raise the funds required to renovate the Community House and park grounds as identified in the 2011 concept design study performed by the Detroit Collaborative Design Center. The estimated cost was \$2.5 million. The funding for the consultant position was included in a grant proposal that NRPCA submitted on 6/29 to increase our capacity to carry on a capital campaign. While waiting for the response to the proposal a process was implemented to select the leading candidate for the consultant position, and I'm happy to report that an outstanding candidate, Richner & Richner, was recommended by the Capital Campaign Leadership Committee and approved by the Board at its August meeting. We're hopeful that, if our grant proposal is approved, we can immediately engage Richner & Richner for what is envisioned to be a 4-month process of conversations with neighborhood and extended-community individuals as well as philanthropic foundations, corporations and government agencies. The result of this process will be a strategic fundraising plan for the Capital Campaign.

Sad news arrived during the past week that my former neighbor on Warwick, Clarence Leggs, passed away. He and his wife Roslyn, a former NRPCA Director, were stalwarts of the neighborhood. Clarence did innumerable Community House maintenance jobs and served on numerous committees over the years. They relocated several years ago but have kept in touch with many people in the neighborhood. Our condolences go to Roslyn as well as to their children Leslie and J.P.

## MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING Park Players Fall Play

Antonio: an old man, brother of Leonato.

Balthasar: an attendant on Don Pedro, a singer described by Benedick as a "cat who sounds as if someone is killing it".

Don John: "the Bastard Prince," brother of Don Pedro and the main villain.

Hero: Leonato's daughter; beautiful, sweet, gentle, and demure.

Ursula: a waiting gentlewoman attendant on Hero.

Dogberry: the constable in charge of Messina's night watch; an idiot with a large sense of self-importance.

Verges: Dogberry's partner.

A Sexton: the judge of the trial of Borachio.

The Watch: a watchman of Messina.

A Boy: serving Benedick



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## Park Resident Turns Love for Tomatoes into \$650 for North Rosedale Park Legacy Project

For nearly two months, Barbara Harvey's basement and driveway looked like she might be giving up her day job as an attorney to become a farmer. Tomato plants were everywhere or so it seemed. Harvey had decided to take her love for tomatoes and do something to contribute to the Capital Campaign to renovate the Community House and the surrounding park.

She began in early April with seeds for 16 varieties of tomatoes – cherry, paste and black, to name a few. Starting in her basement, she planted seeds in small cells. Once the sprouting began, she then transferred the seedlings to pots and placed the pots in her driveway. Then began the task of watering the plants daily, sometimes several times each day, and moving plants inside to avoid frost and back outside for the sun. Once the tomato plants were established, she sold them to friends

and neighbors and during June Day activities, designating the proceeds for the Capital Campaign. She raised \$650.

A resident of North Rosedale Park for 20 years, Harvey had no idea of how much work would be involved in taking care of 300 tomato plants. "At the end, it was non-stop tomato activity," she said. "I was living tomatoes for more than a month."

Although the plants required hours of attention each day, Harvey has no regrets. "First of all I wanted to use it to make people more conscious of the Campaign. And I think I did that," Harvey said. Each person who purchased a plant received instructions on growing tomatoes and information about the fundraising effort. "A lot of people can't afford to write a big check. I wanted to motivate other residents to think about what they could do to raise money for the Capital Campaign," she

added. "Our community center is in need of some major improvements."

And this isn't the first time she has sold tomato plants to benefit the North Rosedale Park Civic Association. Last year, she raised more than \$200 from plant sales and donated the money for playground maintenance.

Now that all the plants have been sold or given away, Harvey can turn her attention to her real job and enjoying the fruits of her labor. "We have tomato salad every day. I make my own tomato sauce and gazpacho," she said. "I have enough tomatoes from my garden for the entire year. I just love tomatoes."

## This Just In! NRPCA 2011 Survey Results

Patience is a virtue and we thank you for yours. Last year the NRPCA Membership Committee conducted a survey to determine needs and interests of community members. 99 people completed the survey. This is less than 10% of the 1600 households in NRP; however, the results are likely a fair reflection of our community.

#### **SURVEY PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS:**

67% of respondents were female and 33% were male. Most (68%) were in the age range of 55 and over; 29% were 36-55 years of age and 3% were in the 22-35 age range.

Survey respondents have lived in the park an average of 19.3 years. 90% were currently NRPCA members and have been members for an average of 16 years. These demographics suggest that a majority of the respondents have been members of the Association during most of their residency in the Park.

Close to half (48%) have worked as volunteers. Of those who noted that they did not volunteer most (56%) indicated having a busy schedule or no time as the reason. A vast majority of respondents (74%) indicated they would be willing to volunteer which demonstrates strong commitment to this community by its residents. Yea! Us!!

## SURVEY RESPONSES TO THE QUESTION OF WHAT DO WE CURRENTLY DO WELL:

Communication including the Tattler (30%), events and activities (27%), safety and security (13%), sense of community (11%) and maintenance of Community House and grounds (11%). 4% of respondents stated that we do everything well!! Ahh – we try!

#### **ISSUES AND CONCERNS:**

Per respondents, the top three most pressing issues facing the NRP community are crime (66.0%), vacant homes (63.8%), and property maintenance (51.1%). Other issues rated as follows: taxes (42.6%), code violations (25.5%) and lower property values (21.3%).

We also asked what we could do to improve. Highest responses included: outreach to neighbors (24%), nothing (13%), increase membership (11%), and youth and young adult activities (11%).

As an editorial comment, I absolutely realize that many of us put forth an effort to maintain and improve our community, but I would like to emphasize that to address the issues identified and make the improvements noted, all of us, not just the board of directors, committee members or block club captains but EVERYBODY who lives, works or plays in the North Rosedale Park community must contribute. You can do this by watching out for your neighbors, maintaining your property, joining the association, volunteering, etc. Overall, we do many things well and we have much to build upon. I hope you agree that *living in North Rosedale Park is insanely awesome*. We have a lot going on, and an out of this world community spirit.

We want to thank all those who responded to the survey and give props to all NRPCA members and those who volunteer. We'd love to claim that 100% of NRP households are members of the Association. Your support is needed. And, remember, membership dues are now tax deductible!!!
