Several media reports of the event had their usual cut-and-paste negative tone with a focus on the one or two outspoken individuals among the many that made thoughtful statements or asked questions. However, a great deal of information was exchanged, both ways, and the capacity crowd in the building was well served by our hosting the event. Many thanks go to Marsha Bruhn for working with the City to make this happen. Earlier that day, in spite of the heat, Betty Redditt, Michael Matrescu, Matthew Kamara, Duane Fueslein, Marcia Closson, Cheryl Buswell-Robinson and Marsha Bruhn rejuvenated the flower beds in front of the Community House by adding a new layer of compost. It looks great, and they have plans for other areas of the park. Please speak to Betty or Cheryl if you would like to join their work crew. Their contact information is on the back page of the Tattler.

Last month I wrote about what the Civic Association does and why it's important that everyone be open to serving on the NRPCA Board of Directors and/or to plugging into its many activities. There are a few changes on the horizon to bring to your attention. The Membership Committee is one of the oldest and most valuable units of the Civic Association. Tamara Kamara have assessed its catalog of membership information and concluded that an upgrade is needed. So, a completely new database is being constructed. It will reside in the "cloud" to insure data security, and it will help us facilitate acknowledgements for membership dues as well as other donations in accordance with our new 501(c)(3)



non-profit status. Also, after several years of great service, Karen Johnson-Moore will be stepping down as chair of the Membership Committee at the end of 2012. She's very interested in assisting the Board to identify potential successors for consideration, so please contact Karen at kjmoore21@sbcglobal.net to learn more about the position. The Capital Campaign is currently in somewhat of a quiet stage. NRPCA has submitted a grant proposal to obtain professional support for its fundraising operations, to obtain seed money to establish a new staff position known as a program manager, and to perform some early renovations to the patio and the south-end of the parking lot. This month a brief description of the fundraising positions will be given, and more information will be provided about the program manager and patio and parking lot renovations in later editions.

Two fundraising positions are being sought on the advice of the Capital Campaign's Fundraising Advisory Committee. In June a request was sent out to several professional firms to obtain proposals for the consulting services they could provide to determine the feasibility of NRPCA raising \$2.5 million to renovate our Community House and park grounds. With that knowledge, a fundraising plan will be developed to identify a donor base, a schedule, and NRPCA's requirements to run a successful capital campaign. The time-frame for this consulting phase is approximately four months. This would be followed by the introduction of a fundraising manager that would execute the fundraising plan on a day-to-day basis. It's estimated that the manager's length of service will be two years. The time frame for receiving a decision on the grant proposal has a degree of uncertainty to it, but we're hopeful that something will be known in September. Until then, as noted above, we're in somewhat of a quiet phase. Hopefully it's only temporary.

North Rosedale Park Legacy Project • Securing Our Future

Capital Campaign Update. Much behind the scenes work has been taking place the last few months as NRPCA's Leadership Committee prepares to launch the formal part of the Capital Campaign to renovate the Community House and Grounds. Here are some highlights.

- 1. Formation of an Honorary Committee. The purpose of the Honorary Committee is to identify persons with stature in the community who will act as active ambassadors for our cause, help to identify resources, and, hopefully, make a personally meaningful gift towards the Campaign. The fifteen persons who have agreed to serve range from Mayor Dave Bing and Justice Patricia Boyle to Freman Hendrix and Councilman James Tate.
- 2. <u>Kick-off event to raise Leadership Gift</u>

- donations. Having some funds in hand helps in going to foundations, by showing that there is an up-front financial commitment from the neighborhood, even before initiating a full campaign. The lovely May 19th event at Chris and Carol Allen's Bretton Drive home raised \$58,000 in pledges. With other pledges received to date, including donations from the Boy Scouts and Park Players, the seed money totals almost \$70,000.
- 3. <u>Board commitments</u>. There is a 100% commitment from Board members and officers to make a pledge in support of the Campaign.
- Capacity-building grants. While our grant to the Ford Motor Company to fund capital improvements to support the move of the Northwest Farmers Market to the park

- grounds was not approved, our grant request to the Kresge Foundation has been revised and is under consideration for patio and parking lot renovations, a short-term fundraising consultant, and fundraising and program manager positions.
- Fundraising consultant. Interviews have been held for a fundraising consultant to develop a Capital Campaign feasibility study and plan. A recommendation is expected to go to the full board in August.
- Hiring of an owner's representative. Former NRP resident Don Scheible has been approved by the Board as our Owner's Representative for architectural and engineering activities. Don is generously donating his time as we undertake this major project.

City of Detroit Bulk Pickup is Tuesday, August 7, 2012

The City will collect up to one cubic yard of bulk from the curb in front of your home four times a year.

One cubic yard of bulk is about the size of a couch, stove or refrigerator.

Your one cubic yard of bulk cannot weigh more than 1,000 pounds.

Bulk items totaling more than one cubic yard or weighing more than 1,000 pounds will not be collected, and the homeowner and tenant will be subject to a fine

The Greening of Detroit: Be a part of it!

Many thanks to all the generous, visionary North Rosedale Park residents who participated in tree plantings over the last three years with The Greening of Detroit. Because of your foresight and willingness to tackle Emerald Ash Borer Disease which decimated the Ash trees lining our blocks, our neighborhood is a step ahead of many other communities in re-forestation. With vour help, almost 500 new trees were planted in the Park. Though much progress has been made, there is much work to be done. Too many homes are still without a tree on their berm. If *your* berm is bare, please consider this: trees provide beauty, air cleansing, noise reduction, much needed cooling - which reduces utility bills as well as shelter and food for wildlife. If this is not enough to convince you to plant a tree. please note: trees add 10% to your property values and those of your neighbors!

To reduce stress on your trees and to help them thrive, The Greening of Detroit



advises that in the first 2 years after transplanting, it is important that your tree

receive approximately 15 gallons of water per week - especially during periods of drought. Please remember to water your trees! Mulching around the base of your tree will retain moisture, reduce weeds and help prevent injury from lawn equipment. A rigid plastic collar placed around the trunk also protects the tree's delicate cambium from deadly weed whackers. To avoid rot, do not pile mulch or dirt directly against the tree's trunk; instead configure the mulch to form a shallow basin, which will help collect water.

Greening has been sending out volunteers who are members of the Green Corps to help water in extreme dry spells, however their resources are limited and your trees need your tender loving care to stay healthy and grow tall. With your help, formally bare streets will soon be beautiful, cool, shady boulevards once again.

Little League (RGLL recently received a \$5,000 grant from the Baseball Tomorrow Fund (BTF), a program of Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association. This grant will provide funding for professional grant writing services to assist in raising funds for the renovation of four youth baseball fields located at Stoepel Park #1.

Located in northwest Detroit, Stoepel Park #1 is used by over 500 players. To address the need for an improved playing facility, RGLL has hired a professional grant writer to raise funds for the overall renovation of the fields.

Other major supporters of the project to date include the City of Detroit, Detroit Local Initiatives Support Corporation, Ford Motor Company, and a host of other local businesses. The Rosedale Grandmont Little League is still accepting in-kind and monetary contributions. COMMUNITY POLICING

PILOT PROGRAM – At the May Neighborhood Safety Meeting, the Manhattan Institute, in cooperation with the Detroit Police Department (DPD), Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC), and the GRDC Community Security Program, unveiled a new 90-day Community Policing Pilot Program for the Grandmont Rosedale neighborhoods.

This pilot includes increased police activity on the streets beginning June 4, 2012 (i.e., "broken-window" policing); pro-active home visits to the men and women who have caused the most harm by invading OUR homes (i.e., committing B & E's); and increased citizen participation, the backbone of this program and every

form of community policing. Residents must accept the responsibility of "see something, say something," and incorporate it into their everyday lives. Learn more about this initiative's scope and the role of local residents in the *Guidelines for Community Policing & Checklist: How to Identify and Report Suspicious Behavior*. 
