troit Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). In addition to getting a beautifully renovated home, homebuyers will also receive down payment assistance and free homebuyer counseling to insure that they get off on the right foot. To qualify to purchase a home under this program, homebuyers must meet the following requirements:

Have an annual household income at or below 120% of the area median income

Be pre-approved for a mortgage with a reputable mortgage lender

Complete 8 hours of pre-purchase homebuyer counseling

Make a down payment equal to no less than 1% of the purchase price from your own funds.

<u>President</u> The President is the principal executive officer of the Association and presides over all meetings, represents the Association on public occasions and appoints Chairpersons of committees.

IT'S FLU SEASON!!!! The best time to get vaccinated is **October** or **November**. You can, however, get vaccinated in December or later. In addition to the flu shot, there are other adulthood immunizations that should not be overlooked.

- The Pneumococcal for adults 65 years and older need two 2 doses for a lifetime
- Tetanus/Diptheria you should get this every 5-10 years.
- Herpes Zoster 60 years and older, only 1 is needed.
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) up to age 26 (9-26)
- Meningococcal Conjugate especially recommended for college student or people who live in dorms.
- The flu shot is needed every year for high-risk individuals and people by 60 years of age.
