Registration will be at the North Rosedale Park Community House where visitors can board a shuttle bus for a short tour of the neighborhoods, talk with vendors about tax abatement and financing, enjoy popcorn and refreshments, and find out about other services in our area.



Traffic Calming for Grandmont Rosedale??

Recently an informal group of Grandmont Rosedale residents met to form an ad hoc Traffic Calming Work Group to study ways to make our neighborhoods safer and cleaner through various traffic control measures known as "traffic calming." Traffic calming is the most effective way to reduce speeding on residential streets, avoid traffic accidents, and prevent fatalities, according to the Institute of Transportation Engineers.

Detroit's Palmer Woods neighborhood recently instituted some traffic calming measures and residents there are now very satisfied with those improvements. Grandmont Rosedale residents decided to explore how we might incorporate similar measures in our neighborhoods.

Representatives from all five Grandmont Rosedale neighborhoods have begun to learn more about various ways to improve safety and reduce noise, pollution, littering and speeding in our area. The first step the work group is taking is sending out an 'interest survey' to collect opinions from area residents about traffic, speeding, noise and pedestrian safety concerns.
