

Little Free Library Comes to Rosedale Park

Take a book. Leave a book. This is the simple idea behind the Little Free Library movement. In its most basic form, a Little Free Library is a box full of books where anyone can stop by and pick up a book or two, and bring back another book to share. The mission of the Little Free Library movement is to "promote literacy and the love of reading by building free book exchanges worldwide, and to build a sense of community as we share skills, creativity and wisdom across generations." Originally started in Wisconsin, this great idea has really caught on and is spreading.

Now the Little Free Library movement is taking root in Detroit. They are popping up all around the city – east side, west side, all around the town. There's already one in North Rosedale, at the Community House. There's one in Minock Park, in front of the home of Minock Park Block Association President Vicki Holmes, on Plainview.

Now there's a Little Free Library in Rosedale Park! Stop by to visit, in front of the home of ROSEDALE PARK NEWS Editor Jim Dwight and his wife, RPIA Board Member Pam

Weinstein, at 14810 Faust, just north of Eaton. "Come check it out – take a book or two, bring a book or two. This is a fun way to share knowledge and the love of reading with our neighbors," Dwight commented.
