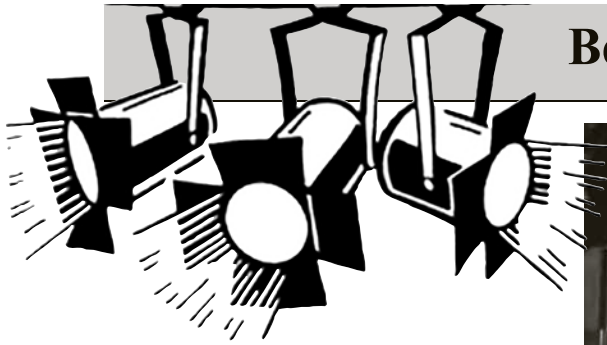

COME TO THE AUDITIONS

Ted Briseno (*Police Officer, Accused of Beating Rodney King*)

"But probably the things that hurt the most - was that I wanted my children to look up to me...As their father... First, but I wanted them to look at me as a hero, I didn't have a hero, when I was growing up. I didn't have a father. My father died when I was eight. But I think it was a heart attack. It's funny, cause back in the sixties, you know everybody seemed like when someone died. It was like heart attack, heart attack, heart attack, everybody was a heart attack. My oldest sister. She said, 'Dad died of a broken heart.' 'Bein' older now, I know what she meant, by a broken heart. And he couldn't provide the way he would have like to have...I just you know, to this day it's still in the back of my head was that he died of a broken heart."



Twilight, Los Angeles, 1992, is a play of monologues like the one above, drawn from interviews in the days following the LA riots. Sadly, the beating of Rodney King in 1992 foreshadowed many recent events such as the shooting in Ferguson, MO. The Park Players will present this powerful and thoughtful drama in November. The casting will be conducted on Wednesday evening (7-10pm), Sept. 9 and Sunday afternoon (1:30-5:30pm), Sept. 13, in the North Rosedale Park Community House.

We hope that you will come to one or both of the auditions and select a monologue to read. You may ignore the gender and ethnicity of the actual speaker. Simply try to feel the pulse and the motivation of the individual being interviewed. For this show, actors will not be needed at all of the rehearsals which are usually held on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, as well as Sunday afternoons. We can work around your conflicts. So please plan to participate.

There will be up to 37 different characters cast in the production. They include Jin Ho Lee, shop owner; Gina Rae AKA Queen Malkah; Alice Waters, Chef, Chez Panisse; Jessye Norman, opera singer; Daryl Gates, Former Chief of the LA Police; Angela King, Rodney King's aunt; Cornel West, scholar; Maxine Waters, congresswoman; Elaine Brown, former head of the Black Panther Party; Maria, juror #7; and Bill Bradley, senator from New Jersey.

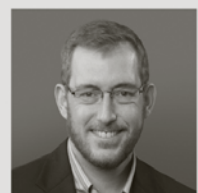
