What's Next?



Residents to Hear More about Legacy Project Through Expanded Outreach Effort

Over the next several months, residents of North Rosedale Park will get a chance to invest in their community by supporting efforts to renovate the Community House and surrounding park, as the Legacy Project of North Rosedale Park moves to a broad-based campaign.

Residents will see and hear more about the Legacy Project in the coming months, as brochures with details about the project are mailed to each household. Signs displaying the rendering of the renovated Community House, showcasing a 3000-square-foot addition, will be installed on the grounds. An updated Web site will be launched allowing individuals to contribute to the effort online.

For more than a year, leaders and supporters have worked behind the scenes sharing the Legacy Project with potential major donors and applying for foundation and government grants.

Their efforts have resulted in \$539,275 being raised to date. The target for phase one is \$750,000.

Earlier this year, the NRPCA board approved a master plan for the Community House and grounds. Phase one of the plan includes a new lobby, handicap-accessible entrances and restrooms, larger office, and electrical upgrades and Wi-Fi installation.

As fundraising efforts continue, Legacy Project leaders are hoping for Board approval in May on the hiring of a preconstruction manager and are working towards a September groundbreaking.

What is the Legacy Project of North Rosedale Park?

For nearly 75 years, the North Rosedale Community House and the seven-acre park surrounding it have been the focal point of our community. As with any building, time has taken its toll on the Community House. In order to address many of structural problems and the need to update the facility, the Legacy Project of North Rosedale Park was created. Funds raised will correct structural problems -- sinking floor, electrical and plumbing issues, and handicap accessibility -- and enhance activities by creating a new lobby, expanding the parking lot, installing additional lighting, and renovating the patio.



Since last year a group of residents of the five Grandmont Rosedale neighborhoods have been meeting, networking and researching the possibility of reconfiguring traffic patterns like Palmer Woods has done. This Traffic Calming Work Group has put together a timeline of all the tasks that need to be done. So far we are right on track.

Come hear plans for traffic calming in our community

Our first public Traffic Calming Community Wide Meeting of residents from all five communities, North Rosedale Park, Rosedale Park, Minock Park, Grandmont and Grandmont #1 will be held on Tuesday, May 27th at 7pm at the Community House 18445 Scarsdale.

In preparation for the meeting, all residents in each neighborhood are asked to fill out a Traffic Survey at https://www.surveymonkey/s/2FNDQL8 Also if you prefer, you can also fill out the survey at the Community House. Paper surveys will be available in the lobby on the bar.

Residents will be asked for their opinions many times during the course of the project to determine major problem streets and major traffic and safety issues. Nothing will be permanently implemented without

real world temporary testing with your feedback. In about two weeks, all of the surveys will be analyzed by neighborhood, collated together and then analyzed as a group by Wayne State traffic professionals.

By May 27th, we will have a preliminary report to share with you at the Community Wide Meeting. Please put the date on your calendar.

Northwest Detroit Farmers' Market Relocates to the Community House


Same day. Same time. Same market. NEW LOCATION.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT ORDINANCE GOES TO CITY COUNCIL

As of this writing (mid-April), Detroit City Council is set to consider adoption of an ordinance that would allow for the creation of a Special Assessment District (SAD) in our community to support an increase in neighborhood security and snow removal services. These funds would be controlled by our community to benefit our community.

To check the current status of the ordinance, visit the GRDC website at www.grandmontrosedale.com or www.mygrandmonStrosedale.org.

Once an ordinance is adopted by City Council and approved by the Emergency Manager, attention will shift to implementing a Special Assessment District in Grandmont Rosedale. To create a SAD in our area, we will need to collect the signatures of 51% or more of property owners on a petition. This will require an enormous organizing effort and help will be needed from dozens of volunteers.

Locally, this effort is being spearheaded by a Task Force representing each of the five Grandmont Rosedale neighborhood associations and GRDC. Currently, the Task Force is seeking new representatives from the Grandmont 1 and Minock Park neighborhoods. 
