Leaders Wanted for 2016 NRPCA Board

The North Rosedale Park Civic Association (NRPCA) is accepting nominations to fill expiring terms of office for the 2016 Board of Directors as well as for the positions of Vice-President and President. Applicants must be members in good standing of NRPCA, reside in North Rosedale Park (owner or renter), and have paid 2016 dues. Submitted names will be checked against membership records, and, if your dues are unpaid, you will be notified. Applications must be received NO LATER than November 8, 2015. Director positions are two-year terms, and four such positions must be filled for 2016. The office of Vice-President is a one-year term, and that of President is a one-year term followed by one year on the Board as the Immediate Past President.

After nominations are received, the Nominations Committee will meet

to compile a slate for presentation to the community. The slate will be finalized at the December 10, 2015 General Membership Meeting, at which time further nominations will also be accepted from the floor. All certified nominations are placed on the ballot, and all NRPCA resident and life members in good standing may vote for the slate at the NRPCA Annual Meeting on January 8, 2016.




