IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: SNOW REMOVAL SERVICES

Greener Still will no longer be providing snow removal services. They sold their business and the new company is not providing this service. We are researching options that may be available. If you would like to assist us or if you know of a company that might be interested in providing this service, please call Nicole Daniels, or Bob Bonner.

Please know - It will be difficult to find a company that is willing to bill individually as Greener Still did. We were told, many residents did not pay the snow removal fee of \$65 per year.

Fiscal Update:

As in past years, we are still experiencing financial difficulties. As such, the Association does not have funds to cover the cost of snow removal. While we are experiencing some gains in community house rentals, we are still falling short on the number of people paying membership dues and on our fundraising goals.

As always, we are thankful to all of you who consistently support the Association and ask that you please continue to do so and to encourage your friends and neighbors to do so as well. Our resident membership numbers hover around 300. We have 1700 households. We can do better!!! Membership dues of \$75 per year can now be paid in full, or \$19 quarterly or \$7.00 per month. We hope these options make it feasible for EVERYONE to join!!!!

Capital Campaign Improvements:

- Progress continues on the installation of a new roof and solar panels on the Community House.
- A Request for Proposal has been let for Architectural and

Something to note:

The Association has an interesting dichotomy. We have essentially two financial foci, one is the Capital Campaign, which has and continues to raise funds (\$800,000 to date) for building improvements and renovations through grants, donations and fundraisers. Their efforts have been extremely successful as evidenced by the new addition, general improvements to the building, new roof, solar panels, new doors (pending), new parking lot and circular drive (pending) and plaza off the south lobby (pending).

On the other hand, we have operational costs. This includes, for the most part, expenses to keep the Community House operating, upkeep to the grounds, publishing the Tattler, youth programming and events such as; Easter Egg Hunt, June Day, Pancake Breakfast, Girl Scouts, youth sports, family movie night; and adult health and wellness which includes; Walking Group, Health Fair, Nutrition Classes. The Community House is also home to the book club and certain community wide meetings. Whereas the capital campaign has been extremely successful in obtaining grants to help reach ambitious goals, grants, most often do not pay for operational expenses. These expenses are paid for from membership dues, community house rentals and fundraisers.

We are committed to thinking more outside of the box and also to establishing a fundraising plan for 2017 that will be more ambitious and better organized with solid commitments from the board and North Rosedale Park residents and community members. We can make this a better functioning, more sustainable Association and with your help, we will.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL STARTS OCTOBER 1ST!!!!

Shortly, you will receive your membership renewal form in the mail. North Rosedale Park is the only neighborhood in Detroit with its own private Community House and Park. The Community House and Park are assets to the community at large and to all of us who live here.

On a regular basis, people who visit the Community House make comments about how nice a neighborhood this is with its beautiful homes and well-manicured lawns. They marvel at the Community House and state how lucky we are to have it. They talk about how they can see there is a strong sense of community and often state how they wish they had such a facility and as strong a sense of community pride where they live. These comments and these impressions are valuable. They influence the perception of our community as a great place to live. Translated, this improves our home values and the resources we are able to attract. Your support and your efforts are key to this perception. Thank you, again for your support!!!!

In actuality, opening night is not quite so easy as is implied by these lyrics in "Everything's coming up roses" from the iconic musical *Gypsy*. Before the curtain is opened and the lights are turned on, many tasks must be completed.

First, the Community House must be turned into something resembling a theater. This transformation involves putting up stage extensions left and right, hanging curtains in the north balcony to create a semblance of dressing rooms, and setting up long, well-lit mirrored tables for applying make-up. On opening night, the House Manager is the first to arrive. S/ He checks to see that the tables and chairs are properly placed so the house decorators can begin to transform white tables into colorful circles enhanced by decorations often reflecting the theme of the play to be performed.

Next, actors begin to filter in. They hurry upstairs to carefully apply their make-up, change into their costumes, and start the process of "getting into character".

Then it's time to check that the sound and light systems are working. The prop mistress makes certain all of the needed props are preset where they belong. The house manager confirms that the volunteers selling refreshments and hanging coats are ready to go. The doors are open, and the ushers begin seating the audience in their assigned places. The house manager circulates around the backstage giving actors and tech folk time warnings: 30 minutes, 15 minutes, 5 minutes. The director gathers the actors together helping them focus, reminding them to help each other. And we're ready to go.

The house lights dim. The audience

settles itself. And the magic that is theater begins.

A Remembrance of Mary Ratkowski on the 1st Anniversary of her Passing

November 18, 2016 marks the one year anniversary of the passing of a beloved community member, Mary Ratkowski. Those of us who were fortunate to be her family and friends will forever remember her quiet, smiling, thoughtful, generous presence in our lives. Although many Tattler readers might not have known Mary personally, our neighborhood and beyond was enriched by her actions. Mary's passion for justice and peace, stoked by her years teaching in Ghana, led to her involvement in a multitude of organizations working toward those ends. Bread for the World, The Fair Housing Center of Metro Detroit, Amnesty International, Manna Community Meals, The Capuchin Peace and Justice Office, and especially the North Rosedale Park Civic Association and the NRP community could always count on Mary to be there whenever needed.

Mary and her husband Chris chose North Rosedale Park to raise their son Eric, and daughter Katie. The family was actively involved in Sunderland block activities, with Mary also serving stints as Co-Block Captain. While Eric and Katie attended Cooke Elementary School and then Ludington Middle School, Mary found ways to be supportive of the school communities. As the kids got involved in local neighborhood sports, primarily soccer and/or hockey,

Mary and Chris volunteered time and effort to make those programs viable.

A stalwart supporter of the North Rosedale Park Civic Association, Mary put years of time and effort into helping the NRPCA in its efforts to sustain a vibrant community. Her efforts included two separate multi-year stints as the Recording Secretary of NRPCA. She used her prodigious writing and organizational talents by serving several years as Editor of The Tattler, and also was a member of the Radio Patrol and many June Day committees. When a volunteer was needed, Mary was there.

Local businesses had a true friend in Mary. Three years ago, Mary and three cohorts (Carol Cristo, Kathy Hoard, Carole Ann Beaman) were the very first Always Brewing Detroit customers, waiting to enter as the final inspection took place. In addition to ABD, Sweet Potato Sensations, PAGES Bookstore, and others benefited from her loyalty. She was also a faithful, enthusiastic supporter of The Northwest Farmers' Market and other GRDC initiatives, and a steadfast volunteer at Rosedale Recycles for over 20 years.

For the last 7 years of her life, Mary quietly battled cancer, enduring the burden of chemotherapy and its side effects. She never let that get in the way of her commitment to what she believed was important. She did everything she could to turn her dreams of justice and community into reality. Mary really was a person who lived the change she wanted to see in the world. She did not seek praise for all the ways she participated in the life of this neighborhood; she let her actions speak much louder than words. Near the end of her life, Mary and Chris made plans to support the Reverse Raffle Gala that was held last December 5th. Although Mary passed on November 18th, her husband Chris, and daughter Katie, attended the event. Mary had left clear instructions, "If her ticket won the raffle, the money should be donated back to the NRPCA." That request was a perfect example of Mary's generous spirit.

Mary's family continues the legacy of love she left. She always looked for the good in others, and extended her best in return. Whether you knew Mary or not, the life of this community will continue to be enriched if each of us follows any part of the example she left for us. The best way to remember and honor Mary and the commitment she made to this neighborhood is to find some way to make real commitments of our own to keeping North Rosedale Park a vibrant place to live.
