Letter from the President

Hello Neighbors!!

Great things are continuing to happen in the neighborhood!! I feel so much community pride as I walk, ride and drive through the neighborhood. I love North Rosedale Park and the people who live here. Just as an example, we have a few neighbors who spent several days working together to retrieve a kitten from a tree. It's sort of a little thing but as some would say, "it's the little things that count." It's a heartfelt example of human compassion and caring.

We had a wonderful time at the "**Annual Steak Roast**." Kudos to the entire committee for all your hard work!! A special thank you goes to Roland Breech aka the "Grill Master", who led the effort. The Association got a much needed shot in the arm from this successful fundraiser.

By the time you read this, hopefully, you will see the installation of a new roof and solar panels on the Community House. This project is being done with funds raised from the Capital Campaign. THANK YOU to Marsha Bruhn, members of the capital campaign steering committee, Don Scheible, Owner's Rep and for all who contributed, large and small, to the Capital Campaign for making it happen. Savings in our energy bill will be calculated and reported on.

<u>SUSTAINABILITY</u> – You may recall that Cheryl Buswell, also championed this cause. I salute her for her vision.

ENERGY: Installation of the solar panels and LED lights are examples of initiatives we are implementing at the Community House and grounds to help us to be more energy efficient.

WATER: Future initiatives to reduce our drainage fee include installation of a bioswale(s) to capture storm water from the roof, and possibly replace our parking lot with permeable pavers. Another possibility is to "sheet" the storm water from the parking lot onto the grass or into bioswales. We already have a rain garden absorbing storm water on the south end of the parking lot helping to reduce flooding planted by GRDC.

Ultimately, we would love to become a model of sustainable practices, a showcase of what can be done by a non-profit to not just save on energy and water bills but also to protect our environment while also contributing to our personal health and wellness. We call this the triple bottom line where people, the planet and economics are equally valued.

If you have expertise or ideas on sustainable practices, PLEASE let

us know. Let's learn together. At our October 13th general membership / community meeting, we will have a presentation on changes to the drainage fee proposed by the Water Department. The change will also impact residential customers. Learn now, what you can do to lower your drainage fee.

Board members must be able to work well with others, and have the time and commitment to help run a non-profit organization. Changes to the NRPCA By-Laws are Underway

Amendments to the North Rosedale Park Civic Association By-Laws are needed to continue to support the growth and progress of the North Rosedale Park Civic Association (NRPCA). Three members of the NRPCA Board of Directors will be working with a pro-bono attorney and members of the association to make the necessary changes that will ultimately be voted upon by the NRPCA membership.

According to the timeline procedures as explained in the current by-laws (listed below), notice of revision to the current NRPCA by-laws will be presented at the October 13th, 2016 General Membership Meeting. The proposed amendments will be printed in full in the December Tattler, and will be presented at the December 8th, 2016 General Membership Meeting & Member Appreciation Dinner for public input and comment. The revised by-laws will be voted on by the general membership at NRPCA Annual Meeting on January 13, 2017. Changes will also be posted on the NRPCA website, in the Tattler e-blast and on the NRPCA Facebook page.

ARTICLE VIII 8.001 Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended in the following manner: The Board acting at any regular or special meeting, or any group of ten (10) or more members, may file with the recording secretary for presentation to a meeting of members such amendment(s) as they think advisable. In the case of amendment(s) submitted by a group of members, the recording secretary shall first submit such amendment(s) to the Board, which after due and thorough consideration, shall report to the members at their next meeting, with a recommendation for or against adoption, or the Board may recommend alterations, additions, or omissions.

The amendment(s) both in original form and with any alterations, additions or omissions, must be read at a general or special meeting of the Association. The person or committee sponsoring the amendment(s) will be permitted to explain briefly its purpose and answer questions thereon, but there shall be no debate.

The text of the proposed amendment(s) shall be conveyed to the membership at least thirty (30) days before the vote on adoption by:

- Publication in The Rosedale Tattler; or
- Internet access through links provided on the official website of the Association; and

- Posting in the Community House

At the following general meeting the proposed amendment(s) will be subject to debate and may be adopted by the members with or without the alterations, additions or omissions recommended by the Board.

A two-thirds (2/3) majority of the members present and voting is required for the adoption of any amendment.



Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs Awards Funds for Parking Lot Improvements

The Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA) has again supported renovation efforts for the Community House and park grounds with a \$33,991 award towards replacement of the parking lot. As anyone knows who has visited the Community House recently, the parking lot is badly deteriorated from age and the recently constructed addition to the building.

This is the third grant from MCACA for The Legacy Project—a multiyear initiative to renovate the 75year old Community House and improve the park grounds. Each grant has required a match. The first grant was part of updating lighting and electrical in the main hall, including the installation of acoustical panels to improve the experience for the hearing impaired. The second funded solar panels in conjunction with the new roof designed to reduce operating costs. The current award, along with a \$100,000 grant from the city of Detroit, will provide the majority of funding to widen the circular drive and replace the parking lot, potentially, in part, with permeable paving for better storm water management.

Parking lot improvements will greatly enhance the experience for the many thousands of people who utilize the park grounds and attend theatrical performances and other events at the Community House. MCACA's grants recognize the important role of arts and culture in communities' quality of life. While NRPCA is not solely an arts organization, over 30% of the use of the Community House and grounds is devoted to arts and cultural activities. One of the main reasons the Civic Association was awarded these funds is that the Community House is home to Detroit's oldest Community Theater group, The Park Players. This group has been providing high quality theater for our residents for over 65 years and MCACA recognizes the value this group provides to our community.

We are extremely grateful to MCACA for its confidence in our ability to utilize its funding for the benefit of the public, and for contributing to the long-term sustainability of our facilities. Look for opportunities at upcoming NRPCA membership meetings to hear about, and weigh in, on the final design.






