Letter from the President

WE GOT THE HUD GRANT!

As I look back over the last year, it has been a rewarding year. We received notice that HUD approved our request for \$194, 000!!! And we are moving quite well with our fundraising efforts. At last count, we had \$210,000 raised with \$150,000 received from pledges! Our neighbors are really stepping up to fund the campaign. Marsha Bruhn, Christie Peck, Cathy Marshall, Becki Kenderes and Chelsea Neblett have put a lot of work in to send off a Letter of Inquiry for an ArtPlace grant. This grant would be to spruce up the grounds with public art, an amphitheater and other enhancements. We will know next year if we have been invited to submit a full grant application.

MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

Now is a good time to renew your membership in the North Rosedale Park Civic Association. The dues are \$60 per year. Remember, your dues are now tax deductible. Other benefits of membership include:

Capital Campaign Raises \$500,000 of \$625,000 Phase One Goal

Attendees at NRPCA's December Membership Appreciation Dinner broke out in applause at the news that the Capital Campaign had reached \$500,000 of the \$625,000 Phase One goal to renovate the Community House and grounds. The most recent news was the verbal confirmation from the City's Planning and Development Department that HUD has approved the 2013-14 Community Development Block Grant Action Plan which includes our grant request of \$194,000 for handicapped accessibility at the Community House. In addition to the grant, by mid-December we had received \$210,000 in pledges from individuals, \$76,000 from The Kresge Foundation, and \$25,000 in-kind. While this is impressive, we still have a ways to go to reach our April target for Phase One.

We're very appreciative of the support we've received from our residents and friends of North Rosedale Park. If you've already pledged, thank you! If you haven't made a pledge, or haven't been contacted, we hope you will be receptive when you get the invitation to be part of this really momentous project for our neighborhood and the larger Grandmont Rosedale community.

Be sure to attend the January 10, 2014 NRPCA Annual Meeting when our architect will be present to discuss the progress with the building plans. We will want to hear your feedback on the conceptual drawings that he'll have at the meeting.

The Code Enforcement Committee keeps residents informed of the required city zoning and building code regulations and helps to enforce them, thereby helping to maintain the quality of life in the Park that attracted people here in the first place.

The Vacant House Task Force has helped to secure vacant homes to prevent vandalism, and maintained the properties through grass cutting and debris removal.

Monthly Neighborhood Safety meetings are held with 8th Precinct police officers where residents are given tips on improving the safety of their homes, identifying suspects, and other public safety measures to improve neighborhood security.

SOCIALIZATION:

Social events are held regularly in the neighborhood, such as the **Easter Egg Hunt, June Day, Steak Roast, Holiday Pancake Breakfast, Park Players Theatre Parties, Home and Garden Tour, and Zumba classes**. All residents are encouraged to meet and enjoy their neighbors. North Rosedale Park is the only community in Detroit to host its own community theatre group, The Park Players.

BEAUTIFICATION:

The NRPCA is the only community association in the city of Detroit which

owns its own **Community House and grounds including a modern playground**. The cost of staffing and upkeep of the Community House and grounds is covered by membership dues and rentals. Residents volunteer to maintain flower beds and Park entranceways.

CIVIC POWER:

The higher the number of members of the Association, the more powerful our voice will be when we request city, county, and state services. In numbers there is strength.

In real terms, the cost of membership in the North Rosedale Park Civic Association for Park Residents is \$60.00 per year, or \$5 per month, or just \$.16 per day. Being a member of the NRPCA entitles you to all of the things listed above and makes you an owner and contributing member of the community. Only residents of North Rosedale Park who have paid their dues by the **annual meeting (January 11, 2013)** and Life Members of the NRPCA can vote in the election for Board Members.
