#### **Behind the Footlights**

#### SISTER ACT

Scene 4: a police station;

Scene 5: Queen of Angels Cathedral

(the narthex);

Scene 6: the dining hall; Scene 7: the chapel.

And so it continues for twenty-five scenes. How is it possible to create the sense of place when every few minutes, we must take the audience to a different locale? Easy to accomplish in a film; not so easy on the North Rosedale Park Community House stage. Even more challenging when the entire set must be transported to the Redford Theatre. where the Park Players will present the final weekend of their spring musical. And then there is the issue of the much larger space at the Redford.

Drops (the painted fabric that is rolled up and down at the back of the stage) are not an option. Can't be moved. Flats (muslin or luan covered surfaces which create a background) are cumbersome and challenging to move. A third option, periactoids (triangular prisms of wood with different scenes on each of the three sides) can not provide the multitude of scenes needed. They also pose difficulties of scale, different sizes being needed for the two venues

What is a harried set designer to do? Rely on the magic of theater.

First, keep it simple. Provide suggestions of environment; avoid trying to create a literal place. Then open your tool bag of theatrical tricks. Use set pieces. Use



furniture (a confessional, a table, a row of chairs, a street lamp). Then add lights – blue suggests a place that is cold or dark, red is hot, passionate, energetic; amber is warm, comfortable, friendly; white is bright, harsh, institutional. Next we have sound. We hear cars; we're on a street. Sirens – police or fire trucks. Birds and insects – out-of-doors. Church bells – well, you get the idea.

The final piece is most critical. It's called "dramatic license". It is the real magic of theater and you, our audience, help to create it. Call it the "willing suspension of disbelief". You walk into the theatre, and you set aside your usual expectation of rational assessment. You cheerfully fly backwards or forwards in time. You are transported to another city or another country or another planet. One moment you are in a leafy park; an instant later, a fashionable boudoir. Only when the curtain is lowered do you return to real time in your not altogether comfortable seat in a drafty theatre.

### FUNDRAISING BEGINS FOR TWO MAJOR ART INSTALLATIONS IN NORTH ROSEDALE PARK

World-class art in the form of a sculpture and mosaic is coming to North Rosedale Park, and The Legacy Project organizers are already working to raise funds.

The Great Art! Great Park! Park project, with a \$76,000 grant from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation and matching funds, will feature two major art installations by renowned Detroit artists Charles McGee and Hubert Massey.

Charles McGee, a Rosedale Park resident whose work is displayed at the Detroit Institute of Arts and the Charles Wright Museum of African American History, will create a 25-foot metal sculpture on the park grounds.

Internationally-known artist Hubert Massey will create a mosaic on the face of Cooke Academy on Puritan Street. Massey has art on display at the Museum of African American History and Campus Martius and is completing work at Cobo Center.

To raise the needed funds, several events and activities are planned through the fall.
