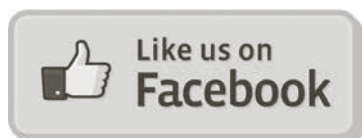

On October 1st, we celebrated an incredible milestone as we broke ground to make way for our new expanded Community House. It was an exciting day; the media accompanied our community to celebrate a new page in North Rosedale Park history. We can all look forward to the day when we walk through the door of the new addition and remember the ground that was broken on that very spot. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this important and wonderful project. While we should all be very proud that we are so close to our \$750,000 phase one goal, we still have approximately \$25,000 more to raise to complete the renovation for this phase, so if you haven't done so, please contribute today.

There are many ways to donate – online at northrosedalepark.org; sending a check to the Community House; or, if you are interested in having your name placed on the plaque, you can contact our incredibly determined and enthusiastic Legacy Committee chair, Marsha Bruhn at 313-400-1192. Her hard resolute work has been inspiring. The media attention and amount of money she and the committee have raised has been monumental. Of course the real result will be when we proudly walk through our new entrance and lobby knowing that this community's continued support of the *Legacy Project* has left an indelible mark for the many generations of families yet to come.

While the support for the *Legacy Project* has been amazing, it has been a tough couple of years for our operating funds. Additional fees from the city, increases in utilities and lower participation in events and membership have really put a pinch on our day-to-day operating budget. These funds are used to

keep the lights on, the doors open, the grounds maintained for rentals, events hosted by the association, and a place for your children, their children and their children to play. In light of the challenges with our operating budget, the board voted to increase the yearly membership fee to \$75. While no one likes to pay more money, we hope you'll realize that the costs to operate this building continue to creep up. To keep up with the insurance, gas, electricity, water and the general maintenance is an ongoing battle. If everybody paid their membership, these budget challenges would not exist. Please do your part and pay your fair share. Your \$75 membership makes the load of keeping the community house incrementally lighter. Your commitment to the organization and our beautiful neighborhood directly improves the entire community's quality of life.

Another and even more enjoyable way to support the operating funds of the Community House is to join us for the Park Players production of "Alice Through the Looking Glass". This benefit performance is Saturday, November 15 at 6:30pm. Proceeds from the ticket sales will support the operating funds of the civic association and there will be food and refreshments! Food, neighbors, and a timeless tale of fantasy and wonder! What could be better? Not much in my opinion but, if you think of something, let me know and we'll see what we can do!

Alice Comes to the Community House

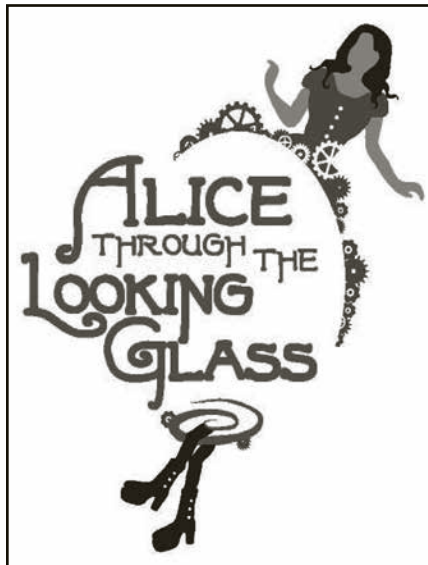

For those who like to look ahead, this winter, Park Players will produce the macabre musical comedy, **The Addams Family**. This recent show was based on the Charles Addams' characters taken from his original gag cartoons which depicted a ghoulish American family. The Broadway production starred Nathan Lane and Bebe Neuwirth. It played in New York from April, 2010 through the end of 2011, when it began its national tour. At that time, it was the third most successful show on Broadway behind only **Wicked** and **The Lion King**.

Auditions are scheduled for Wednesday, January 7 at 7 PM and Sunday, January 11 at 1 PM. The show will run on the last three weekends of March, 2015. Additional information will appear in the December edition of The Tattler.

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Legacy Project Reaches Significant Milestones in October Work to Begin Inside Community House; Campaign Reaches Match

Donors and supporters of The Legacy Project of North Rosedale Park had two reasons to celebrate in October. At the beginning of the month, an enthusiastic crowd of nearly 100 witnessed the ceremonial groundbreaking for the Community House addition. On October 31, the Legacy Project successfully completed a crowdfunding campaign with more than 75 donors from across the country pledging \$20,000, triggering another \$20,000 through a matching grant with the State of Michigan.

Organizers had hoped to begin construction on the Community House addition in October. However, plans hit a snag as bids for construction came in higher than expected. Over the next several months, bids will be finalized and the construction budget adjusted based on the bids. Organizers expect to begin construction in the spring instead.

"We set an ambitious schedule with the hope of beginning construction this fall," said Marsha Bruhn, Legacy Project Chairperson. "However, we recognize the importance of being good stewards of the funds that have been raised for such a significant project. In the meantime, in response to our residents, we intend to move forward by addressing some of the needs of the existing building."

Over the next several months, crews will work on the interior of the Community House, focusing on:

- Upgrading the electrical system to improve the power supply for theatrical productions and kitchen appliances;
- Adding energy-efficient lighting in the main hall ;
- Improving acoustics in the mail hall by repositioning the speakers and adding sound-absorbent materials;
- Improving the overall appearance of the main hall with wall treatments and painting.

With the interior work scheduled to begin soon, excitement for The Legacy Project is building. That excitement was evident as an enthusiastic crowd of nearly 100 donors and supporters gathered for a ceremonial groundbreaking at the Community House on October 1. Groundbreaking participants included U.S. Congressman John Conyers; Detroit City Councilmember James Tate; Detroit Free Press columnist Rochelle Riley; Architect Guss Pappas; and Laura Trudeau, The Kresge

Foundation Managing Director. North Rosedale Park was represented by Marsha Bruhn, Karen Johnson Moore, Erma Leaphart-Gouch, Jim Johnson and Don Scheible. The groundbreaking event received media coverage by the Detroit Free Press, WXYZ (Channel 7), WWJ and WCHB.

Enthusiasm from the groundbreaking soon

spilled over to the news that more than 75 individuals pledged more than \$20,000 to successfully meet the matching grant with the Michigan Economic Development Corporation. The matching grant was the result of a partnership between NRPCA, Patronicity and the State of Michigan. The result: more than \$40,000 was raised for The Legacy Project in October alone.

Funds are still needed to complete Phase One. So far, more than 200 individuals, organizations and foundations have made financial commitments for Phase One.

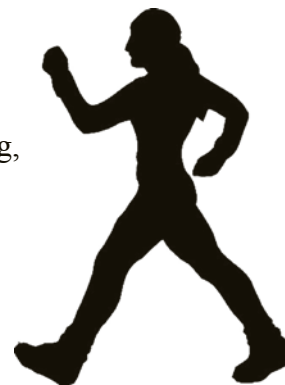

aka: Rosedale Tattler eBLAST EDITION

This April marked the beginning of the Rosedale Tattler eBLAST EDITION. An electronic newsletter designed to supplement the printed version of the Tattler will be distributed via email. The eBLAST EDITION is not intended to replace the printed Tattler, but to provide vital and interesting news, information and reminders that sometimes miss the Tattler deadline (the 10th of each month). The eBlast should arrive in your email around the 3rd week of each month so as to meet this objective. In order to receive the eBlast you must be on the "list".
