Letter from the President

Greetings, neighbors.

Snow Removal: As I started writing this column on Sunday, February 11th, we had been getting regular snowfalls since late on the 8th and I measured 9 inches of snow on the top of my Courville container. The City is clearly struggling to deal with the repetitive dumps of snow, but despite the hiring of contractors by the City to start plowing residential streets at 6:00 AM on Saturday morning with the goal of clearing 10' wide paths down the center of the street within 24 hours, most streets in North Rosedale were covered with 6 or more inches of snow on Sunday evening. As a result, Beverly



Frederick, one of our Block Club network leaders, and I separately reached out to Stephanie Young, the District One manager, to ask for additional help. The City did send additional trucks out late in the afternoon on Monday the 12th and the streets began to look much better. Of course, this raises the question: What can be done to get better snow removal in North Rosedale?

As many of you know, for many years -- at least since the mid-1970's and up to the winter of 2015/2016 – snow removal of streets and sidewalks was done by a private company – Greener Still – which was owned and operated by a resident/former resident of North Rosedale. This was paid by a direct billing to each household by the contractor. The NRPCA was not involved in or responsible for this service. Even though not everyone paid, the system worked pretty well for many years and one of the advantages of living in North Rosedale was having plowed streets and brushed sidewalks. Payment for the services gradually waned, and in the early 2000's Greener Still found it necessary to drop blocks where a sufficient number of residents did not pay the annual fee. Greener Still finally decided to go out of business and since that time we have been without regular snow removal service.

In addition to lobbying for better City snow removal, the options going forward would seem to include, at least:

a) Everyone takes care of themselves, helps their neighbors, and hopes for the best;

b)Each block (or several blocks on one street) attempts to contract for snow removal service through an annual contract or on a per push fee basis (apparently Lancashire between Warwick and Outer Drive has such a contract); or

c)If there was widespread consensus that we should have a neighborhood wide snow removal, the NRPCA could contract on behalf of the neighborhood to have snow services provided. This is done in Rosedale Park, Grandmont and Grandmont I where snow removal is the primary expenditure for their dues. If the NRPCA did it we would either have to have a dues increase or have a separate collection to pay for the entire cost of the snow removal.

I am aware that there have been some conversations on the Nextdoor website in the past few months regarding trying to look into options for getting better snow removal for North Rosedale. I have not heard the results of those efforts, but if the people investigating it think the Association can be helpful, I am sure the Board would be open to considering new ideas, even though historically the snow removal in the neighborhood was not a responsibility of the Association. If there is interest in doing so, this topic can be addressed at the next general membership meeting on Thursday April 12th.

Pothole repair: One piece of good news is that, despite inclement weather, the city followed up on the commitment to repair the crater in the alley behind Little Caesar's. Work was done by DSWD crews early in February and the crater is now covered with asphalt, eliminating the dangerous condition that existed there. We will report on other follow up by the City to our January meeting with the mayor as they occur.

Upcoming Events: You can check the events calendar on the back of the Tattler to see what is going on at the Community House. Most events for March are the standard classes and meetings, but if you have small children, you should put Saturday, March 31st on your calendar for the annual Easter Egg Hunt. This is a fun program and is run jointly by volunteers from North Rosedale, Rosedale Park, Grandmont, Grandmont 1, and Minock Park. It is a real community event for the little ones.

Membership: Please join us in our efforts to maintain and improve our neighborhood by paying your 2018 membership dues as soon as possible. Membership dues are the basic lifeblood of the Association. Along with the rental of the Community House, the dues provide for much of the basic operation and maintenance costs for the Community House and Park. Dues continue to be \$75 per year and can be paid in full with a credit card or on a quarterly basis right at the www.nrpca.org website. Just go to the home page, scroll to the bottom and click on the "Pay Your Dues Here" box to get started.
