Dues Increase

At the GCA annual meeting held at Christ the King Church on April 13, the ballot proposal to increase the annual membership dues from \$25 to \$30 was approved. This increase will take effect on September 1st. Dues received prior to September 1st will still be \$25. You still have the option to use PayPal or mail dues to our PO Box. You may still also pay your block captain if that is your preferred method. This increase is necessary to cover services that the GCA provides to ALL residents, homeowners and renters alike, including street snow plowing which is our most expensive service. We are still much lower than Grandmont 1, Rosedale Park and North Rosedale. Also we will be going to a *Dues Invoice* system similar to what is being used in Grandmont 1 and Rosedale. Each resident who is not current in their 2019 membership dues will be getting a GCA dues invoice mailed to their home this summer requesting payment of their GCA membership dues. It is our hope that this will increase membership participation and also relieve some of the burden from our block captains. Your prompt payment is appreciated.

Please treat this invoice as you would treat any bill you receive. It is your participation that makes it possible for the Grandmont Community Association to offer all its benefits that our neighbors enjoy and expect. It would be a shame to eliminate snow removal as North Rosedale did two years ago. We all benefit from plowed streets during the winter. Please do your share and be part of the great neighborhood organization that traces its roots back to 1927.

Please remember that poison will NOT do the whole job. Rats are a people problem. Too many people are not paying attention to what needs to be done to eliminate this danger & health hazard. What you need to do:

Garbage & Rubbish

- Drain & always bag garbage before putting it in your container. No loose garbage!
- Do not store garbage outside the container in bags or boxes
- Keep your container clean (use a bleach-mixture periodically to clean out your container)

Building Maintenance

- Fix broken basement windows and screens and keep basement windows closed
- Remove trash from basement, garage, and shed
- Place door sweeps on all doors leading outside

Exterior...Clean Up

- Keep yard free of dog manure
- Remove leftover dog food and water before dark
- Cut weeds and remove brush from yard and alley
- Elevate wood and other materials at least 18 inches off the ground
- Do not store non-running vehicles for long periods of time which can create nesting areas
- Clean up under porches and crawl spaces
- Remove trash from yard and alley

Loud | music into the early morning creates tension among neighbors and can be easily avoided by renting a hall and/or ending your party at a reasonable hour. Neighbors, older folks, workers on various shifts, sleeping babies (and their parents), etc. will all appreciate your thoughtfulness.

FRIENDLY REMINDER AND SAFE PRACTICE. Detroit City Ordinance Article 1/50-112 states that you cannot play basketball (games) in the street or place a basketball hoop in the street. Not only is this a SAFETY issue as cars often SPEED down the streets which puts those playing at serious risk of injury or worse, but a Quality of Life issue for neighbors as well as drivers.
