Get Ready for Rosedale's 60-Block Yard Sale

Rosedale's legendary Yard Sale has been extended - Let's get rid of stuff! Saturday AND Sunday, June 22-23, from 9 a.m-3 p.m., rain or shine

The theme of this year's Rosedale Yard Sale is: "Where did all this stuff come from?!!"

RPIA would like to bring the fun back to our annual event with more organization, advertising and promotions, as well as increasing the number of buyers and sellers - *Team up with your neighbors and get rid of the clutter!*

New changes coming to the sale this year:

- The Yard sale has been extended throughout the weekend to include both Saturday AND Sunday;
- Buyers will be able to download a map of homes participating in the yard sale, along with brief descriptions of the goods for sale at each home;
- Getting the word out to a wider audience:
 - Press release for major news outlets to promote the event
 - Increased promotion of the event through online and print ads
- Residents can register to sell items during the yard sale:
 - Registration fee: \$5 per home (10 or more homes on same block \$3 per home)
 - Registration fee gets your home placed on the 60-block yard sale map with a brief description of your goods
- A drawing among registered homes to win a \$50 VISA gift card

Participation by both buyers and sellers in our sale has fallen off in the past few years. Buyers were frustrated because prices were too high, so they didn't return. Sellers were upset because items weren't selling, so they stopped participating. Let's turn those downward dynamics around with this year's sale – follow the tips on our website, RosedalePark.org!

Cleaning Up The Islands

One way to improve the look of the island on your block is to plant flowers. Well I've got a deal for you: Tina Castleberry, owner of the Garden Bug, is offering 10% off on all flower flats throughout the season to block captains/island gardeners. The Garden Bug is located at 18901 Grand River (corner of Stahelin).

With the warmer weather, it's a great time to spruce up the islands. RPIA Island Beautification Committee

member, Carolyn Murphy, says a little maintenance will go a long way. "Picking up sticks and branches, raking leaves, and digging around the beds is a good first step," said Murphy. "Also, now is the time to spread pre-emergent weed killer."

Which type of flowers work best on our islands? Along with perennials (like flowering bulbs), marigolds, salvia and begonias are flowering plants that add color to the islands – and they are inexpensive, drought tolerant, and last through October.

Need some ideas on beautifying your island? Contact RPIA's Island Beautification Committee, Carolyn Murphy (313-838-1768); Ruth Remus (313-837-3215); or Deborah Tunstull (313-549-1339). If you stop by the Garden Bug, ask for Tina, a master gardener who has a wealth of ideas and best practices.

Another idea is to form an island committee to spread the work to many hands. The committee can decide on a schedule for major work projects and set up a regular schedule for picking up trash.

Finally, the Beautification Committee will begin island judging in mid-to-late August.

Let's work together and continue to make Rosedale Park a jewel in our city.

On Saturday morning, April 13, about 25 Rosedale neighbors were joined by 15 student volunteers from the University of Michigan to clean up Rosemont Acacia Park, our neighborhood park, , and to clean up the four blocks of the Southfield Service Drive between Fenkell and Acacia. The Northwest Detroit Farmers' Market Begins Its 15th Season!

Thursday, June 6

The 15th season of the Northwest Detroit Farmers' Market will begin on Thursday, June 6 at the North Rosedale Park Community House, 18445 Scarsdale. The hours this year will be 3 – 7 pm, and the Market will run until October. Opening Day at the Market will include local food trucks, many returning and several new vendors, music, and of course a healthy dose of community. This season there will be monthly themes such as "Healthy Planet, Healthy You" and "Think Globally, Act Locally." This is the first year that the NWDFM is serving in an advisory position with the Community Markets, the umbrella organization that supports many Farmers' Markets in Detroit, including Eastern Market. As the third largest and second longest continuously running Market, our Market is a terrific example of how a non-profit and the community it represents can work together to offer and sustain something of value to the community. The Market will again offer Double Up Food Bucks and shuttle service for four nearby
