# Letter from the President

Greetings, neighbors,

As I write this in late May, we are looking forward to another great June Day with a few changes from recent years. After I attended the June Day committee meeting the other day, I can report that it appears to be shaping up to be great event.

Just to mention a few of the activities and attractions: the Parade will include the always popular Ghostbusters group who will be hanging around afterwards to mingle with the crowd. It looks like we will be able to get appearances from the Detroit Police Department's Mounted Police, the Helicopter, the Bomb Squad and the Canine Corp. The Detroit Fire Department is also expected to appear unless they are called away on a run and the kids enjoy inspecting the truck up close.

We will have the usual parade and bike decorating competition, followed by a brief ceremony to recognize the Grand Opening of the renovated Kitchen and all the usual Field games. Additional attractions include a petting zoo, ponies, and the street-based Train which will be giving rides most of the day. This year the food during the afternoon will be provided by food trucks, including an Ice Cream Truck, a Hot Dog truck, a Fish & Shrimp truck, and a Roll Up truck, at least. An expanded Craft Bazaar should add a different flavor to the activities. A returning tradition which we have not had for a few years will be the free evening concert – this year featuring the Detroit Social Blues Band – sounds great to me! Hope you will be able to attend for at least part of the day.

## New Garbage Schedule Beginning June 10, 2019

### Garbage/Pickup Weekly

- All garbage should be bagged and placed in the container.
- Place container within 4 feet of the curb with handle facing the residential unit and away from the street.
- Place in front of all other waste to ensure access by automated collection vehicles.
- Place container at least 3 feet away from all other objects such as mailbox, car, recycling cart, etc.

### Recycling/Pickup Biweekly

- Place container within 4 feet of the curb with handle facing the residential unit and away from the street.
- Place in front of all other waste to ensure access by automated collection vehicles.
- Place container at least 3 feet away from all other objects such as mailbox, car, recycling cart, etc.

### Bulk Waste/Pickup Biweekly

- Residents are allowed up to 2 cubic yards of bulk items per pickup which is approximately the size of a sofa or 2 stoves
- Items **NOT ACCEPTED** include: Construction and demolition debris, hazardous waste, other unacceptable waste materials (see website)
- Prior to disposal, all liquids, food, chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), and any unacceptable waste

### Bulk Waste/Pickup Biweekly cont.

must be removed from bulk waste items and appliances.  
•Items accepted for pickup would not fit into an empty garbage container

### Yard Waste/Pickup Biweekly

- Pickup is every other week for 36 weeks per year. Yard waste collecting begins in April through mid-December. Please check for updates and specific dates at the website below.
- Yard waste must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags or bundles. **NO PLASTIC BAGS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- Brush must not be longer than 4 feet in length or larger than 2 inches in diameter
- Items accepted for pickup include: leaves, grass clippings, tree branches and twigs (Tied and bundled, no more than 60 lbs.)
- Items **NOT ACCEPTED** garbage, large tree debris, tree stumps, soil or dirt.
- Christmas tree pickup is the first 2 weeks in January. Christmas trees must not contain any decorations or materials made of nonorganic material

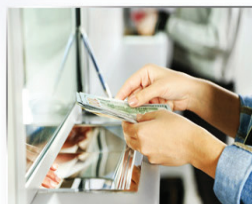
