

Letter from the President

Greetings, neighbors.

Hope the "Dog Days of Summer" find you doing well and keeping cool.

By now you may have heard that our Community House renovation efforts have been further supported with a \$150,0000 grant from the State of Michigan to help us renovate our kitchen and transform it into a commercial kitchen that can be rented by food entrepreneurs and used for cooking -- not just warming-- for NRPCA events. Please note that this is a separate grant from the \$150,000 Kresge grant,



I want to give some overdue recognition to a couple of long serving Community House employees who chose 2018 to retire. Needless to say, the NRPCA is often seen through the actions of its various representatives, whether they are members, volunteers or employees. We have been very fortunate to have some very reliable and competent employees to help us operate the community house. First, I want to recognize our security guard of over 10 years, Charles Kimball. Mr. Kimball was our primary security guard for all those years. That means that he would often be spending much of his Friday, Saturday and Sundays in the community house parking lot, guiding people to parking spaces, helping people and keeping order. He was the face of the community house for many of our members and guests and we are lucky to have had him for so long. He was totally reliable and represented everything you want in a security guard – he had a friendly but not to be ignored presence about him and was somebody who could maintain order without being oppressive or combative. We all owe him many thanks for helping maintain a sense of security around our community house for so many years.

Similarly, we have all been well served by one of our House Representatives, Claretha "Candy" Doggan, who served for approximately 10 years. Our House Reps have the often-thankless task of being the NRPCA representative on site in the Community House during a rental. Their job is to assist the renter with the operations of the Community House while making sure that the renter complies with our rules and regulations and has a good time without endangering the physical integrity of the Community House or the safety of the guests. Naturally, this is an assignment that frequently takes a good deal of tact and diplomacy to enforce the rules without alienating the renter. Candy and was particularly good at walking that fine line and many renters found her to be a helpful presence rather than a burden. Candy was so good at her job that regular renters, such as the Rosedale Park Improvement Association (RPIA), would request her as the House Rep for their rentals. On behalf of the community I offer many thanks to Mr. Kimball and Ms. Doggan for their exemplary service. They, like most of our employees, are what make the community house a great place. We will miss their friendly and competent presence at our neighborhood's center.

Southfield Fwy construction underway

M-39 (Southfield Freeway) CITIES AFFECTED: Dearborn, Dearborn Heights, and Detroit COMPLETION END DATE: Late October 2018

PROJECT DETAILS:

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is investing \$3.8 million to mill and resurface 6 miles of M-39 (Southfield Freeway) between Ford Road and McNichols Road. Work is already under way and includes concrete repair and replacement, asphalt work, and joint repairs

Work will be performed during off-peak hours, overnights and weekends when only one lane will be open; ramp closures may be required. All lanes will be open during morning and afternoon rush hours.





TREE TRIMMING GUIDELINES & RULES

Before you trim a city tree on the berm or island Residents who are planning to trim City trees on the berms or islands must call Arlene Kirby in the city's Forestry Dept. at 313-332-9115 to discuss their plans and obtain a FREE permit before proceeding with any work. There are rules and guidelines to be followed – please respect our City resources and our neighborhood!

Also important to know: Any branches, etc., must be tied up in bundles, in up to 4 foot lengths, for pick-up by Advanced Disposal. Material that is too large or not bundled will not be picked up and will receive a substantial ticket. Residents may also transport their branches, etc., to the Southfield Yard for disposal - 12255 Southfield Service Drive, M-Sat., 10:30 - 6,



Priority is being given to fallen trees that are blocking streets or on top of homes and vehicles. The City's forestry crews will focus on trees that were rooted on city property or blocking streets and sidewalks.

How to determine if a tree is the city's property or private property:

If the fallen tree is located between the curb and the sidewalk of a home, it is the responsibility of the city and city crews will address them. To report a fallen tree on city property, residents should call 313-628-0900 or fill out a form posted on the city's website.



Tree Removal cont.

If the tree is between the sidewalk and the house or in a backyard, it is on private property and is the responsibility of the homeowner. who should contact their insurance company or a private contractor. If the tree fell from private property but is blocking the street, residents should still call the city at 313-628-0900.

Additional information:

Downed Power Lines: If a fallen tree or limb has impacted a powerline, stay away and call DTE Energy's emergency line immediately at 1-800-477-4747

Removal of tree limbs: If homeowners have taken it upon themselves to cut up a fallen tree or limbs on their property, they should cut the debris into sections no longer than 48 inches and leave it at the curb for their next scheduled yard waste collection date.

TREE PLANTING

As part of Mayor's Duggan's 10 point plan to improve the quality of life for the residents of the City of Detroit, the General Services Department is leading the way in planting 10,000 trees across the 7 Districts of the City. We need your help in reaching our goal of planting 1,500 trees this Spring! Just as you assisted us with the success of the Board Up Brigade, we are asking for your assistance once again, in identifying tree planting locations in your respective communities. We need you on our Tree Planting Brigade! What is 10,000 UP?

The 10,000 UP Tree Initiative will plant 10,000 residential trees in front of residential homes between the street and the sidewalk only. For 2018, the plantings will begin the first week of April and conclude in the month of June, for our Spring planting. We will begin planting in September and conclude in November for our Fall planting. All plantings will be conducted by a City of Detroit contractor. We will not utilize volunteers for this initiative.

What We Need From You?

We are asking that you contact your community members and ask them if they would like a tree planted between the sidewalk and the street in front of their home.

What Happens Next?

After you have provided us with the tree locations and the contact information of those community members requesting trees, we will contact them via phone or door knocker, to verify their agreement to receive the tree. Once they agree, we will then place them on the list for scheduling. We will then provide the schedule to the contractor and your community's trees will be planted within our Spring planting timeline. If we cannot accommodate the request within our Spring planting timeline, they will be added to the Fall schedule.


