Letter from the President

Greetings, neighbors.

Although we are now officially enjoying summer, activities and progress in the neighborhood continue at a steady pace.

New Neighbor Meet and Greet

Because of the Mayor's District One Meeting held on June 27th, the NRPCA has changed the New Neighbor Meet and Greet to Monday, July 9th, 6:30-8:30 pm at the Community House, 18445 Scarsdale. Whether you are a new neighbor or an old neighbor, if you want to learn more about NRPCA

activities, you are invited to come to the Meet and Greet and learn more about the neighborhood from fellow neighbors. Pizza and salad will be available, but if you are planning on attending please notify Chelsea Neblett at chelsea@nrpca.org that you are coming so we will have enough food.

At the Meet and Greet we will have dinner, have the chance to socialize, play some games, and talk about neighborhood and city resources. In addition, our District One Deputy Manager, Latrice McClendon, who lives in North Rosedale, will be in attendance to answer questions about city services. The meeting is kid friendly, so bring your kids along!

Although you do not have to be a member to attend the Meet and Greet, we continue to encourage all North Rosedale residents to support our community building efforts by paying your 2018 membership dues. The stronger the membership, the greater the programs and services available for the neighborhood. Moreover, dues are one of our two main sources of operating funds (as opposed to construction funds from grants) for operating the Community House and Park. Thank you for your support.

<u>June Day:</u> Despite some rough weather June Day took place pretty much as planned. Luckily the rain did not fall during the Fun Run or Parade, or at the beginning of the field games, but it did get pretty steady as the afternoon went on. The dampness did not stop those who attended from having a great time and we owe many thanks to all the volunteers, led by our event chair Tamara Kamara, for their hard work to plan, prepare and conduct the event. The cost of the event was also supported by several generous donors, who we also thank. Hopefully, next year will be drier – so put it on your calendar for the second Saturday in June.

More Improvements Around the Community House: As I write this column, we are receiving bids from contractors for the installation of the new brick plaza and sculpture on the south side of the Community House. In pursuing this project, the NRPCA has been extremely lucky to benefit from the advice, guidance and professional services provided by the Detroit Collaborative Design Center (DCDC), a multi-disciplinary, nonprofit architecture and urban design firm sponsored by the University of Detroit Mercy School of Architecture to assist non-profits and community organizations to design useful and beautiful buildings and public spaces. DCDC has worked with NRPCA, and Don Scheible, our long-time owner's representative, to develop the design for the new plaza and to prepare the bid drawings. We hope that construction will start in late July or early August and be done before the end of August. Plans are in process to have either a ground breaking or dedication of the plaza where we can honor Charles McGee, the world-famous artist who has designed the steel sculpture that will be the center piece for the plaza. We hope to have the mayor in attendance along with other donors and supporters. More specifics will be forthcoming as soon as they are available.

And if the new plaza was not enough to keep us busy, as announced in the last Tattler, NRPCA was one of 18 organizations to receive a Kresge Innovative Project (KIP) grant. Check out this link for more info on the KIP grants which are an effort to spur development of public spaces in the neighborhoods of Detroit. http://www.dbusiness.com/daily-news/Annual-2018/Troys-Kresge-Foundation-Provides-15M-for-18-Detroit-Community-Projects/ NRPCA's Legacy Project received a \$150,000 grant to redo our baseball diamond, playscape and soccer fields and to add an adult walking track and fitness equipment in the park. We will have 2 years to complete the work on this grant, but we hope to start work on portions of these improvements very soon and phase them in as use of the facilities and weather permit, with the hope of being done in one year. Check this column next month for more good news – we are having a very successful year in obtaining grants to repair and improve our facilities and will be able to share additional details by then.

NEW DETROIT ORDINANCES

No Grilling on Front Porches!



Bans open burning or outdoor cooking within 10 feet of a flammable structure or property line or under a roof or enclosure.

requires all burning or outdoor cooking take place in the side yard or rear yard only.

Bans fire pits, campfires, barbecues, smokers, or outdoor ovens in front yards, on front porches, or on sidewalks.

Residents will be liable for all costs of fire suppression and violations can bring a \$500 fine.

No Continuouse Teathering of Dogs!



Prohibits owners from continuously tethering a dog for more than three hours a day.

Specifies tether must be coated steel cable and must be three times the length of the dog, from the tip of nose to base of tail. Prohibits tethering a dog to a stationary object that would allow the dog to come within five feet of any property line.

ROSEDALE BEER AND BISTRO COMING SOON!



Derrick A. Collins, Justin Riopelle, and Josh Guitar, owners of the coming Rosedale Beer and Bistro, 18910 Grand River, are old friends. They worked together at a Detroit brew pub and hit it off pretty quickly. They share a playful, wry sense of humor, often riffing off each other's jokes and finishing each other's sentences, so it seems like a pretty good idea that the three friends are working together to open Rosedale Beer and Bistro – an 85-seat, full bar (with growlers!), full menu of traditional American fare with, as Josh describes it "southern flair and contemporary twists," neighborhood brew pub. Each has his own specialty: Derrick is the chef, Justin is the brew master, and Josh is the front of the house man. While each has his own specialty, they also have taught each other a great deal.

GETTING TO KNOW THE BUSINESS

Josh grew up in Lexington, Michigan and moved to Grandmont Rosedale in 2011. Derrick grew up on the East side, and Justin is from Hazel Park. The three came to their specialties on their own, and didn't meet until they each were well versed in their particular fields. However, they all have had some experience in nearly all aspects of the restaurant business as servers, cooks, bar tenders, house management, and even security.

Derrick grew up cooking. As a kid it was simple stuff – you know, sandwiches, pizza, etc. Derrick's aunt was a caterer and taught Derrick how to cook more sophisticated dishes, and how to cater. When Derrick was 15, he got his first solo catering gig. The night before he was to serve a party of 8, Derrick's aunt taught him how to prepare the sauces that were to accompany the surf and turf with asparagus meal he was to deliver. Derrick's aunt trusted him to cater and cook the meal on his own. She also trusted him with her Cadillac Seville. Derrick felt the trust and confidence that his aunt had in him and loaded her Cadillac Seville with the food, and set out. The meal was a success, and for the next 30 years, Derrick refined his skills.

Justin remembers the fruits his friend used, and soon became "very interested in the process" of brewing beer. CHOOSING GRANDMONT ROSEDALE

While their friendship seems to have happened serendipitously, their decision to open a brew pub in Grandmont Rosedale was quite intentional. For some time there has been an expressed desire by many residents for a full sit-down restaurant in the neighborhood, as Josh has noticed since moving here. As a further encouragement they were awarded a 2017 Motor City Match grant that pairs new businesses with Detroit real estate opportunities and other resources. The building at 18910 Grand River in Grandmont Rosedale is the location where both Motor City Match and the three friends believe Rosedale Beer and Bistro will be successful.

Acquiring the building and parking lots has not been easy, however. The building and lots sit on five parcels owned by five different people. It has taken well over a year to close on just the parking lots, but the three men were not discouraged. In fact, they are noticeably excited about their plans for the space. A build out for the brewery will be on the east side of the building and will be visible through the back of the bar inside the building. There will be tables in the bar area and more on the west side of the building. They also have plans for a small patio, and maybe some blues and jazz in the evenings. They share the goal of, as Josh explains, "a comfortable, earthy family place. We're looking to really fit in the neighborhood."

Just last week, Rosedale Beer and Bistro received approval from the city. They are working on the architectural plans and the funding, so soon you'll see some more changes happening on Grand River. For many years when Grandmont Rosedale residents wanted to eat out at a sit-down restaurant and have a beer or a glass of wine, we would have to go elsewhere. Now not only can we keep our dollars in our neighborhood, but we have options, and in a few months, we'll have another one – Rosedale Beer and Bistro. Welcome, gentlemen. We're happy to have you here.

NEW RENTAL SPACE AT THE NORTH ROSEDAL PARK COMMUNITY HOUSE
