To sign up for weekly trash / recycling / bulk pickup reminder, text your street address to 313-800-7905.

This system works very well. You will receive a reminder around 6 p.m. the day before a collection is scheduled. You will also get other information such as holiday schedules for the City of Detroit, information on hazardous waste disposal, etc.

# GUIDELINES FOR CURBSIDE GARBAGE SERVICE

# Yard Waste collection begins Tuesday, April 9, 2019

Yard waste must be bagged in biodegradable bags or bundles. Plastic bags are not accepted.

Cut and tie 2" diameter brush no longer than 4' in length in a bundle small enough for one person to pick up.

Keep yard waste and bulk items three feet away from trash and recycling carts.

Keep yard waste and bulk items in separate piles. They will not be picked up if they are mixed together.

#### **Curbside Garbage Service:**

Pickup once per week in provided 95-gallon cart.

Collection is performed with CNG (compressed natural gas) automate side-load truck.

Garbage must be placed curbside the night before collection day, or prior to 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.

Place all garbage in provided cart.

Place cart within 4 feet of the curb with handle facing towards the residential unit and away from the street.

Place cart at least 3 feet away from all other objects such as mailbox, car, recycling cart, etc.

Items NOT accepted: hazardous waste, paint, tires, paint solvents, unemptied aerosol cans, compressed gas cylinders, large engine parts, small engines container oils or fuels, chemicals, large glass panes, large tree debris, stumps, ammunition of any kind, dead animals larger than 10 lbs., and firearms.

#### **Curbside Recycling Service:**

Pickup every other week in provided 64-gallon container. Collection is performed with CNG (compressed natural gas) automated side-load truck.

Recyclables must be placed curbside the night before or prior to 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.

Place all recyclables in the provided cart for single-stream collection – no sorting is necessary.

Place cart within 4 feet of the curb with handle facing toward the residential unit and away from the street.

Place cart at least 3 feet away from all other objects such as mailbox, car, recycling cart, etc.

Items accepted for pickup include: glass bottle and jars, aluminum cans and foil, steel and bi-metal cans and containers, scrap metal not exceeding 3' in any dimension, plastic materials made from PET and HDPE (list as Plastics #1 and #2), corrugated paper, newspaper.

#### **Bulk Waste Service:**

Bulk pickup is every other week.

Bulk waste must be placed curbside the night before, or prior to 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.

Items accepted for pickup include: items that otherwise will not fit within an empty 95-gallon cart. This includes furniture, mattresses, appliances, carpet (up to 1 cubic yard only).

Items NOT accepted: construction and debris material, hazardous waste, other unacceptable waste materials.

Additional info: prior to disposal, all liquids, food, chlorofluorocarbons (CFC's), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB's), and any unacceptable waste is removed from the bulk waste and appliances.

This app uses your location and gives you a menu of common quality-of-life conditions to choose from in your service request.

Uploading a photo with your report also helps the City staff quickly identify the problem. You may comment on your submissions and you will be notified when the status of the issue is updated.

# I Can Achieve A Year-Round Program at the YMCA

Grandmont #1 is sponsoring two students for the remainder of this session and will sponsor students when the program begins again in October. I Can Achieve is a college prep/mentoring program which provides a place for students to learn, work, serve, and play.

The students come to the Y two days a week and two Saturdays a month. The two days are for college prep, work readiness, STEM and volunteering. One Saturday covers college tours at Wayne State, Grand Valley State, Central, Ferris State, Wayne County Community, Schoolcraft College, Western, and Eastern to name a few. The other Saturday covers the play which includes bowling, skating, whirlyball, bike riding, etc.

Students have the opportunity to get a summer job for six weeks of work, 120 hours, and earn approximately \$1,000. All graduating seniors will get a scholarship.

Our hope is that all students participating in the program will have a positive and rewarding experience.

Household paints, stains, dyes; Floor wax, floor care product, carpet cleaner; Furniture polish, bathroom cleaners, stain removers, solvents; Pharmaceutical Waste (NON-CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ONLY); Nail polish, glue; Fertilizer, lawn and garden chemicals, pesticides; Antifreeze, motor oil, gasoline; Automotive batteries and dry cell batteries, fluorescent bulbs (all types); Fire extinguishers, smoke detectors; Mercury thermometers, thermostats, elemental mercury and electronics recycling; Computer CPU's, monitors, printers, scanner, keyboards, mice; Cell phones, fax machines, copiers, and televisions.

Only household generated products from Wayne County residents will be accepted.

#### Items that will not be accepted include:

Commercial waste, industrial waste, radioactive material, explosives, ammunition, 55 gallon drums, household trash, refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances, tires, yard waste, roofing shingles, and concrete.
