Lower Drug Prescription Costs Are In Sight!

Under H.R. 3: Lower Drug Costs Now Act of 2019, the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) would identify 250 brandname drugs each year, that cost Medicare the most money and do not have generic competitors. The government would then negotiate the price of at least 25 of those medications directly with the companies. In addition, HHS would be required to negotiate the price of insulin, a drug whose costs per patient nearly doubled from 2012 to 2016.



Flu season is just around the corner! Stay one step ahead of the flu by getting your flu shot. Flu viruses change quickly, and new vaccines come out each year—so it's important to get a flu shot each year.

<u>The Flu shot is free</u> for people with Medicare Part B, once per flu season, it must be administered by a doctor or other health care providers (senior centers or pharmacies) that accept Medicare.

What is the Social Security Benefit?

- \$3,770 for someone who files at age 70
- \$2,861 for someone who files at full retirement age (currently 66)
- \$2,209 for someone who files at 62
- Married to a former spouse for 10 years? You may be entitled to benefits

ROIT Reporting neighborhood problems such as fire hydrant issues, street lights out, running water, potholes, damaged street signs, and other issues to City Hall is easier than ever using the Improve Detroit mobile app.

Improve Detroit app uses your location and gives you a menu of common quality-of-life conditions to choose from in your service request.

Uploading a photo with your report also helps the City staff quickly identify the problem. You may comment on your submissions and you will be notified when the status of the issue is updated.

The 2020 Census Affects You and Your Community

- ⇒ The City of Detroit is gearing up for the 2020 U.S. Census, the nationwide count done each decade of every person living in the United States.
- ⇒ We need to make sure every Detroiter is counted, no matter their age, income, type of residency or immigration status.
- ⇒ An accurate count of the population of Detroit is critical. The city's population number determines how many lawmakers the city gets in Lansing and Washington, D.C., and how much federal funding the city receives for programs that serve Detroiters every day, from nutrition and housing assistance to roads and schools.
- ⇒ The 2020 Census form will be a short set of questions about the number of people living in your household, their ages, race, ethnicity and income. It's critical that you fill out your response will determine Detroit's Population and federal benefits for the next decade.
- ⇒ You can help ensure we count everyone

NEZ Property Tax Reduction Available to Qualified Grandmont #1 Residents

If you own and occupy your home in the Grandmont #1—Rosedale neighborhood and you purchased it after 12/31/96, you are likely eligible for a 15—25% reduction on your property taxes! Many eligible homeowners are already befitting from this program, known as the Neighborhood Enterprise Zone Homestead property tax abatement. The NEZ tax reduction certificate is food for 15 years.

How can you tell if you are already enrolled?

If you are currently receiving two tax bills—one for a parcel #22-xxxxxxx and another for a parcel #27-xxxxxxx— you are already enrolled in this program. If you purchased your home after 12/31/96 and are receiving only one tax bill, for a parcel #22-xxxxxxx, you need to apply for the NEZH!

Necessary qualifications

Here are the requirements for the NEZH, courtesy of the Detroit Assessor's Office:

- Your property must be in one to of the 52 NEZ Homestead Districts throughout the City of Detroit (Rosedale is one of them).
- You must have purchased the property after 12/31/96.
- You must both <u>own</u> and <u>occupy</u> the property as your principal residence.
- You must stay current on your property taxes.
- You must commit to a minimum of \$500 of improvements to your property over the course of 3 years.
- You must have filed a Property Transfer Affidavit (PTA) and Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) with the City of Detroit,
 Office of the Assessor.

How to apply for the program

You may pick up an application in person at the Coleman A. Young Municipal Center, Office of the Assessor, in Suite 804; you may request one by email to assessorsspecialprocessing@detroitmi.gov; or you may call 313-224 6989 to ask that one be mailed to you.


