

#### Letter from the President

Greetings, neighbors,

I am happy to report that we had a great June Day celebration. The weather was excellent. The crowd was much, much larger than last year, and the event went well from the early morning Fun Run until the end of children's movie and the concert by the Detroit Social Club at 8 PM. Don't just take my word for it, here's a sample of comments made on Nextdoor the next day:

Some great additions to the event this year included

- the Detroit Police Helicopter which landed and stayed around about an hour before taking off and buzzing the crowd a couple of times:
- an African Drum group and dance instructor who got a number of the adults up and dancing during the afternoon festivities; and
- the Cass Tech Drum Corp, the Ghostbusters Group and a number of classic cars added a lot of fun to the Parade.

Of course, successful events like this do not just happen but take a lot of planning and hard work. So, I want to thank the June Day Committee who planned and led the event this year: Chair Tamara Kamara and organizers of various portions of the activities including BrieAnn Bell (Food Trucks), Adriane Henry (Field Games), Theresa Glenn (Fun Run), Leslie Vaughn (Face Painting, etc.), Jen Janke (volunteers, etc.), Sara Hulett (kids movie), and Deena Policicchio (Bazaar). Many others helped out in a variety of ways including some who were there for most of the day, including Amy Oaks, Walter Nelson Jr., Roger Loeb, and John Gumbel. In addition, I want to express special thanks to Amy Oaks for the new June Day reminder signs she designed and built with the help of Beverly Stella and Walter Nelson. I apologize to anyone that helped out but were not mentioned above. All the people who volunteered helped make it a great day in the Park and I thank you for your efforts on behalf of the community. Finally, many people helped financially support June Day with a generous donation. We received a total of \$725.00 in donations from residents and former residents that shows how important this event is to the life of this neighborhood. June Day is not a fundraiser, but a "fun raiser" and the donations help make this family friendly event possible and are greatly appreciated.

Finally, I am happy to announce that we have received all our final approvals and operating permits for the kitchen and, other than finishing up a few loose ends, we are ready to start using our new commercial kitchen. We are in the process of looking for some food entrepreneurs to rent the kitchen to on a part time basis and help make the community house more self-supporting. A Grand Opening will be planned for the near future. The extended construction schedule, which took almost 4 months instead of one month, has significantly cut into our rental income for 2019. I will address the details in next month's Tattler, but the bottom line is that I ask that any of you who have not yet paid your dues for 2019, to please do so as soon as possible. Our budget is very tight and your support is needed and appreciated now more than ever.

## Amanda Brewington of Always Brewing Named Deputy Director of Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation

Amanda Brewington is the founder of Always Brewing Detroit, a Grandmont-Rosedale community gathering space that also serves coffee in Northwest Detroit. Amanda was able to own and operate her own business for four years, but sole proprietorship was a journey not a destination. After paying back \$20,000 in loans and receiving business awards from Detroit SOUP, Foodlab Detroit and Motor City Match, Amanda sold her business in November of 2016. Amanda then went on to assist small neighborhood business owners as a Loan Officer for ProsperUS Detroit helping her clients to secure \$500,000 in loans and over \$200,0000 in grants during her two years in the position. In addition to making loans, she also facilitated business plan writing classes and a custom curriculum for soon to open businesses through Build Institute. As of May 2019, Amanda is the Deputy Director of Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation, now serving the same neighborhood where she once owned the coffee shop. Amanda has two Bachelor of Arts degrees from Michigan State University one in Communication with a specialization

in Public Relations and a second degree in Telecommunication Information Studies and Media. Welcome back Amanda and congratulations!


