What do you really know about the elderly? How would you describe them as a group? What about as individuals? Several random people, who were not in direct contact with a senior citizen on a daily basis answered those questions. Here are few of the responses received:

- · The elderly are frail.
- · The elderly seems lonely.
- · Older people live in the past.
- · Elderly people have it easy because they get stuff for free.
- · Older people don't like younger people.
- · Elderly people don't have fun anymore.
- They are sick.

Those opinions paint a rather bleak picture of aging. We may not be able to claim that any of those observations are myths, because sometimes they are true. Instead, we would like to give you 10 facts about senior citizens that even caregivers might not know.

- The Older Adult Recognition Day is generally held in May or in September (Grandparents Day) to honor this most special time in the life of a person.
- 2. The older adult is very likely to vote and to be knowledgeable of the issues that impact the community.
- Suicide among the older adult is seriously high as compared with other age groups. Studies suggest mental health, poor physical health, and loneliness as possible causes. (The National Institute of Mental Health.gov/pmcs)
- 4. A number of older adults face extreme poverty. Studies highlight the urgency of affordable senior housing; continued access to Security, Medicare and Medicaid which serve to provide a quality lifestyle for the older adult.
- 5. The older adult is quite tech savvy. The community colleges in the state of Michigan provide free computer classes for the 60+ older adult.
- 6. Most older adults enjoy a satisfying and fulfilling sex life (HealthinAging.org)
- The older adult has the right to continue to drive a car. At some point in the life of the older adult, family members and friends might need to suggest that the individual consider giving up the keys.
- Dancing is a very popular exercise among the older adult community. This social opportunity helps the older adult improve strength, balance, and muscle tone, along with making new friends. (<u>www.doctoshealthpress.com/food-and-nutrition</u>)
- Older adults are highly valued in the workforce. (AARP.org)The older adult is an individual.


