Keys to Unlocking the Mystery of Curbside "Trash"

Go to https://detroitmi.gov/webapp/find-your-waste-pickup-schedule to enter address and obtain schedule.

- The collection of Trash, Recycling, Yard, and Bulk alternates with the collection of just Trash.
- Text your street address to 313-800-7905 and sign up for reminders on recycling, trash and bulk pickups. A text will come to your phone after 6:00 PM the evening before your collection day. (It takes a bit of mystery out of it!)

Recycling Cart (no garbage!):

- No plastic bags—as in Zed, Zilch, Zip, Nada, NONE! At all! Ever! (No mystery here.)
- · Flatten your boxes.
- Empty and rinse out bottle/jars.
- If you shred paper at home, put it into a **paper** bag, then into recycling cart.
- In doubt if something is recyclable—throw it into trash.
- Tissue papers, clean or dirty, are not recyclable.

Yard Waste (seasonal):

- In Brown Paper Waste bags ONLY, no plastic! Or put into 30-gallon trash bin that is boldly marked YARD WASTE.
- Bundle brush and limbs, in 4 ft lengths.

Bulk Waste:

- Up to 2 cubic yards per pickup.
- More than 2 cubic yds: Call DPW for a special paid pickup: 313-876-0004—it's a good deal!

Hazardous Waste:

2000 E. Ferry Street, every Thursday from 7:30 AM–2:00 PM & the 4th Saturday of each month, 8:00 AM–2:00 PM. ID required to prove Detroit residency.

Recycle Styrofoam, batteries, light bulbs: No plastic bags—Cloth bags help solve that!

Recycle Here, 1331 Holden, open Mon & Wed 10:00 AM-6:00 PM; Sat 9:00 AM-3:00 PM

Miss a pick-up of yard waste or bulk and can't wait:

East Side: DPW J. Fons Yard, 6451 E. McNichols. Year Round, Mon-Fri, 8:30 AM-4:00 PM (closed 12:00–1:00 PM)

West Side: DPW Southfield Yard, 12255 Southfield Rd.

- Winter hours: M-Sat, 8:30 AM-4:00 PM (closed from 12:30-1:30 PM).
- Summer hours: 10:30 AM-6:00 PM (closed 2:30-3:30 PM)
- ID required to prove Detroit residency. Only one visit per day per resident.
