The memorial has been installed at Rosemont Acacia Park and includes the names of Rosedale residents lost to COVID:

- Gwendolyn Carmichael (Warwick)
- Florence Coleman-Owens (Penrod)
- Alice Gilbert (Ashton)
- Irvin Thompkins, Sr. (Piedmont)

• Regina Vaughn (Rosemont)

The dedication begins at 11:00 am and will include remarks from family members of those being honored by the memorial. All are welcome to attend.

TCF Bank has given RPIA a generous beautification grant, which will cover the cost of the memorial. Roman Stone Works graciously donated the limestone, and the entire memorial was installed by Victor Ramirez of VR Landscaping & Construction.

## **TCF Beautification Grant for Rosedale Islands**

Development Corporation (GRDC), to be divided equally among the five Grandmont Rosedale neighborhoods, to help us spruce up our surroundings. This is the second year Rosedale Park has received \$5,000 from this generous TCF grant.

This year RPIA was pleased to put the majority of its TCF funds to work as matching grants to blocks that invested up to a maximum of \$150 in making their island beautiful. Eligible expenses included dirt, mulch, grass seed, flowers, perennials, shrubs, landscape blocks, tools, fertilizer, weed killer, boulders, seeds, flower pots, stakes, etc. These grants were given on a first-come, first-served basis, and over 25 blocks participated.

### **Beatification Committee to Check Islands in August**

FYI to everyone: the Island Beautification Committee will be driving through the neighborhood in August, checking on all the islands to find good candidates for the annual island recognition prizes and awards.

The awards include Winners Circle, Most Improved Winners Circle, Best Maintained Winners Circle, and Best House Landscaping.


