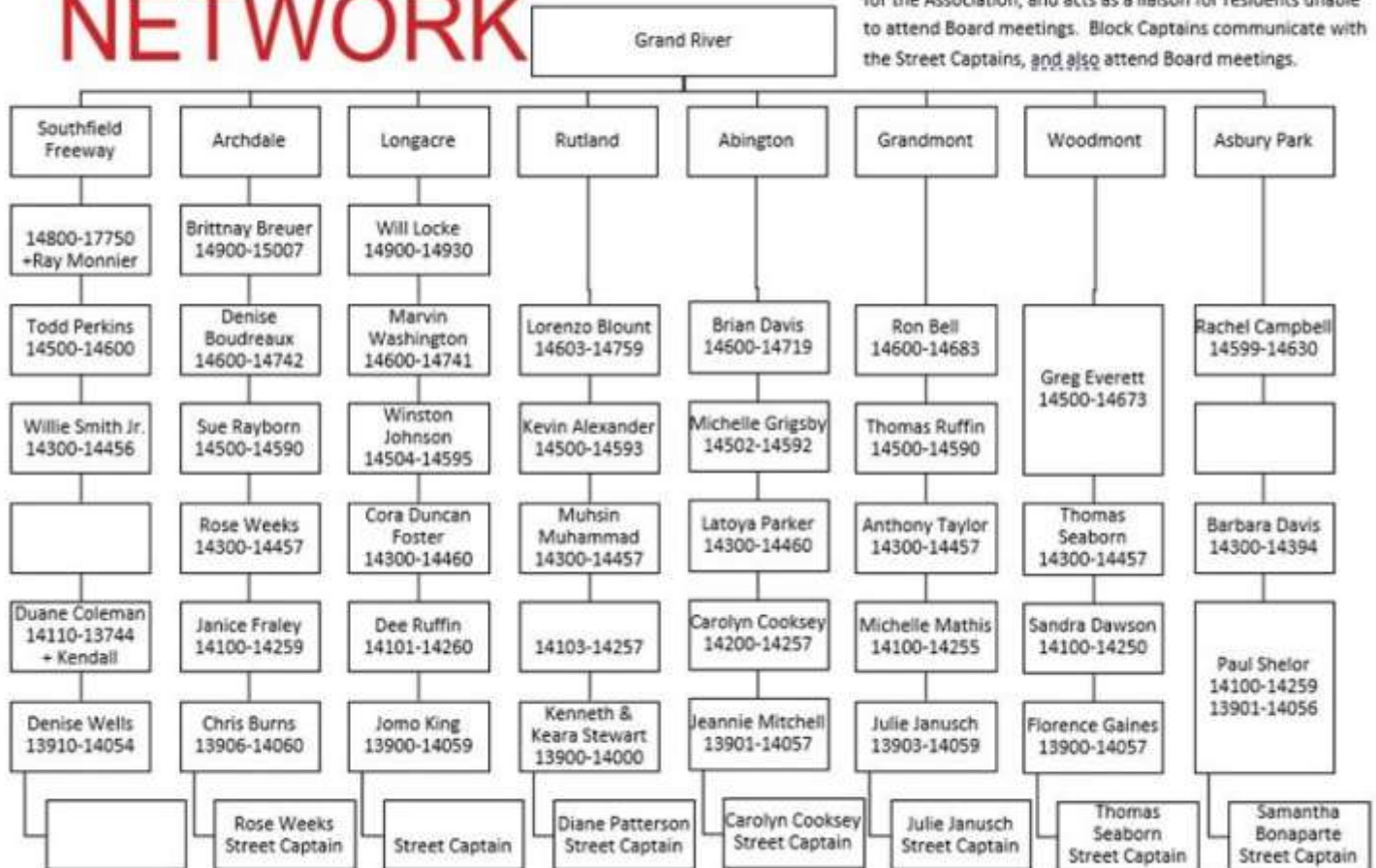

When Munchie trusts someone, he is fully present with them. When he doesn't like someone, he steers clear of them. He doesn't stay with people who hurt him.

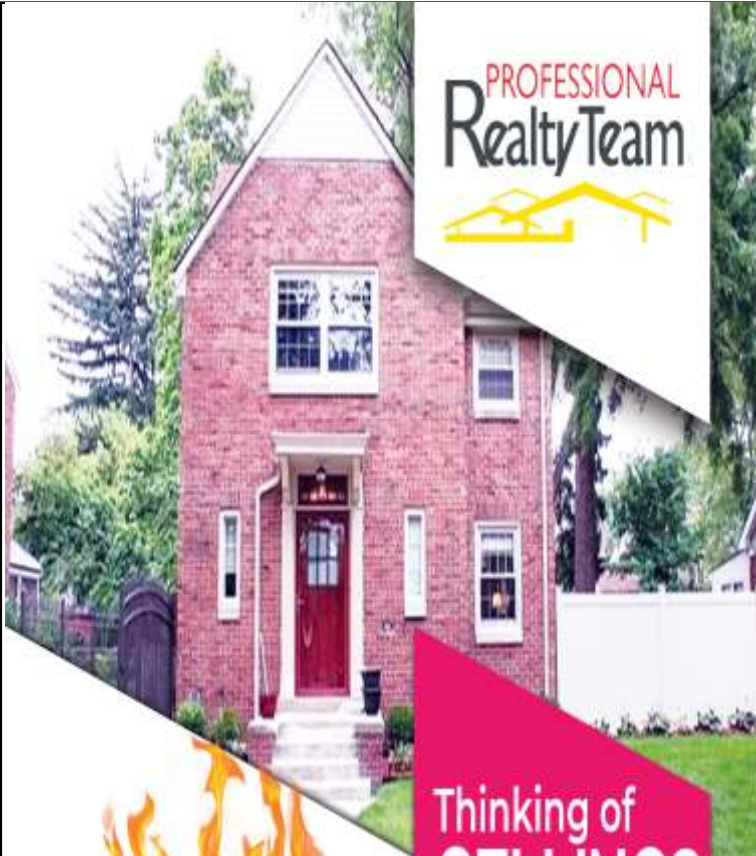
He has no concept that he has to be with anyone. He does not suffer to payoff karma from past lives. He does not wrestle with co-dependency issues.

NOISE COMPLAINTS

The process for dealing with any "Quality of Life" issues (noise, squatters, etc.) is to contact your NPO. For constant loud parties and noise issues, ask him/her to contact or send a letter to the address of the offenders stating that they MUST stop the loud noise. If violators refuse, NPO can contact the city law department where an attorney is assigned who specializes in nuisance abatement proceedings. Once the paperwork is started, the landlord/owner must evict them or a LEIN is put on the property. Contact the 8th Precinct to find out who is the NPO in your area at 313-596-5800.

RIPPLING HOPE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Rev. Carl E. Zerweck, Executive Director, Rippling Hope and Detroit Volunteers completed free home repair for nine Grandmont Community Association Residents. There are three applicants left to be serviced. They will be serviced at a later time. Rev. Carl E. Zerweck chose residents to be serviced from the application packet that I submitted in 2020.

Rippling Hope is an ecumenical non-profit neighborhood focused ministry. Their goal is to improve the physical conditions of targeted communities in Detroit by providing free minor home improvement.

Due to still limited number of volunteers, the Rippling Hope Team did their best to do some projects in our community. FEMA ASSISTANCE

FEMA assistance is available for residents impacted by flooding. The federal government officially approved the state's request for a disaster declaration and ordered federal assistance to supplement state, tribal, and local recovery efforts in the areas of Wayne and Washtenaw Counties affected by severe storms, flooding, and tornadoes from June 25 to June 26, 2021.

Residents and business owners who sustained losses in the designated counties can begin applying for assistance by registering online at DisasterAssistance.gov or by calling 1-800-621-FEMA (3362) or 1-800-462-7585 (TTY) for the hearing and speech impaired. The toll-free telephone numbers will operate from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., seven days a week until further notice.

DID YOU KNOW?

Garbage Ordinance

You could face a steep fine for leaving your garbage container out on the street after a scheduled pickup? Your container also must be placed in the rear of your home – not in view. As a courtesy, please be a thoughtful neighbor. People don’t need to - or want to - see your untidy garbage. Garbage should also always be bagged and secured to help keep rodents away and spilled litter to a minimum:

ORDINANCE: Section 22-2-45. Time limits for approved containers to remain at curb side.

“Properly stored domestic solid waste shall be collected by the Department of Public Works. Owners and/or occupants of residential structures who receive curbside collection shall place approved containers on a berm area not earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the day before collection and shall remove the same not later than 9:00 p.m. on the day of collection.”

PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION of the above Ordinance

VIOLATION of Section 22-2-45 of this Code (above) is a BLIGHT VIOLATION and is subject to a fine:

\$200 for the first offense; \$300 for the second offense; \$500 for the third offense, & \$1,000 for the fourth or subsequent offense. In addition, “Each day on which any violation of Section 22-2-45 of this Code continues constitutes a separate offense and shall be subject to civil fines as a separate offense.”

Please note: if you are a handicapped senior, and need help taking your container to the street and removing it, you can request a [Special Hardship Request](#) to DPW and the City may arrange for workers to help with this service. Restrictions apply. Asking a trusted neighbor might also be a helpful resource for you!
